HOUSE BILL No. 4029

January 15, 2015, Introduced by Rep. Darany and referred to the Committee on Elections.

A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled "Michigan election law,"

by amending sections 758 and 759 (MCL 168.758 and 168.759), section 758 as amended by 1996 PA 207 and section 759 as amended by 2012 PA 523.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 758. (1) For the purposes of AS USED IN this act,
 "absent voter" means a qualified and registered elector who meets
 1 or more of the following requirements:

4 (a) On account of physical disability, cannot without

5 another's assistance attend VOTES WITHOUT ATTENDING the polls on6 the day of an election.

7 (b) On account of the tenets of his or her religion, cannot
8 attend the polls on the day of election.

9 (c) Cannot attend the polls on the day of an election in the

1 precinct in which he or she resides because of being an election

2 precinct inspector in another precinct.

3 (d) Is 60 years of age or older.

4 (e) Is absent or expects to be absent from the township or

5 city in which he or she resides during the entire period the

6 polls are open for voting on the day of an election.

7 (f) Cannot attend the polls on election day because of being
8 confined in jail awaiting arraignment or trial.

9 - (2) Subsection (1) does not apply to ABSENT VOTER DOES NOT **INCLUDE** a person who has moved outside of this state, regardless 10 of length of his or her residence outside of this state, and who 11 12 no longer maintains an actual residence in this state. The storage of personal effects or household goods, the ownership of 13 property that is rented or leased to others, or occasional brief 14 15 visits to a former domicile in this state while residing outside of this state for most of the year does DO not constitute a 16 residence for voting purposes in this state, except for each of 17 the following: 18

(a) A person described in section 1 of article II of the
state constitution of 1963 and statutes enacted under that
section.

22 (b) A person described in section 759a.

Sec. 759. (1) At any time during the 75 days before a
primary or special primary, but not later than 2 p.m. of the
Saturday immediately before the primary or special primary, an
elector who qualifies WANTS to vote as an absent voter , as
defined in section 758, may apply for an absent voter ballot. The

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elector shall apply in person or by mail with the clerk of the
 township, city, or village in which the elector is registered. An
 application received before a primary or special primary may be
 for either that primary OR SPECIAL PRIMARY only, or for that
 primary OR SPECIAL PRIMARY and the election that follows.

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6 (2) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (1), at any
7 time during the 75 days before an election, but not later than 2
8 p.m. of the Saturday before the election, an elector who
9 qualifies WANTS to vote as an absent voter , as defined in
10 section 758, may apply for an absent voter ballot. The elector
11 shall apply in person or by mail with the clerk of the township,
12 city, or village in which the voter is registered.

13 (3) An application for an absent voter ballot under this14 section may be made in any of the following ways:

15 (a) By a written request signed by the voter stating the
16 statutory grounds for making the application.ELECTOR.

17 (b) On an absent voter ballot application form provided for18 that purpose by the clerk of the city, township, or village.

19 (c) On a federal postcard application.

20 (4) An applicant for an absent voter ballot shall sign the application. A clerk or assistant clerk shall not deliver an 21 absent voter ballot to an applicant who does not sign the 22 application. A person shall not be in possession of a signed 23 absent voter ballot application except for the applicant; a 24 member of the applicant's immediate family; a person residing in 25 the applicant's household; a person whose job normally includes 26 27 the handling of mail, but only during the course of his or her

employment; a registered elector requested by the applicant to
 return the application; or a clerk, assistant of the clerk, or
 other authorized election official. A registered elector who is
 requested by the applicant to return his or her absent voter
 ballot application shall sign the certificate on the absent voter
 ballot application.

7 (5) The clerk of a city, township, or village shall have
8 absent voter ballot application forms available in the clerk's
9 office at all times and shall furnish an absent voter ballot
10 application form to anyone upon a verbal or written request. The
11 absent voter ballot application shall be in substantially the
12 following form:

"Application for absent voter ballot for:

14 [] The primary or special primary election to be held on15 (Date).

16 [] The election to be held on _____ (Date). (Check applicable election or elections) 17 I,, a United States 18 citizen and a qualified and registered elector of the 19 precinct of the township of or village 20 of or of the ward of the city of 21 22, in the county of and state of Michigan, apply 23 for an official ballot, or ballots, to be voted by me at the 24 election or elections as requested in this application. 25 The statutory grounds on which I base my request are: 26 27 -[] I expect to be absent from the community in which I am

You must be a United States citizen to vote. If you are not
a United States citizen, you will not be issued an absent voter
ballot.

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A person making a false statement in this absent voter 7 ballot application is guilty of a misdemeanor. It is a violation 8 of Michigan election law for a person other than those listed in 9 the instructions to return, offer to return, agree to return, or 10 11 solicit to return your absent voter ballot application to the 12 clerk. An assistant authorized by the clerk who receives absent voter ballot applications at a location other than the clerk's 13 office must have credentials signed by the clerk. Ask to see his 14 or her credentials before entrusting your application with a 15 person claiming to have the clerk's authorization to return your 16 17 application.

7 (6) The following instructions for an applicant for an
8 absent voter ballot shall be included with each application
9 furnished an applicant:

10 INSTRUCTIONS FOR APPLICANTS FOR ABSENT VOTER BALLOTS

Step 1. After completely filling out the application, sign and date the application in the place designated. Your signature must appear on the application or you will not receive an absent voter ballot.

15 Step 2. Deliver the application by 1 of the following 16 methods:

17 (A) DO EITHER OF THE FOLLOWING:

(i) (a) Place the application in an envelope addressed to the
appropriate clerk and place the necessary postage upon the return
envelope and deposit it in the United States mail or with another
public postal service, express mail service, parcel post service,
or common carrier.

(*ii*) IF THE APPLICATION PROVIDES, FOLD THE APPLICATION WHERE
INDICATED SO THE CLERK'S NAME AND ADDRESS APPEAR ON THE OUTSIDE,

SEAL THE APPLICATION, PLACE THE NECESSARY POSTAGE WHERE PROVIDED,
 AND DEPOSIT THE APPLICATION IN THE UNITED STATES MAIL OR WITH
 ANOTHER PUBLIC POSTAL SERVICE, EXPRESS MAIL SERVICE, PARCEL POST
 SERVICE, OR COMMON CARRIER.

5 (b) Deliver the application personally to the clerk's6 office, to the clerk, or to an authorized assistant of the clerk.

7 (c) In either (a) or (b), a member of the immediate family
8 of the voter including a father-in-law, mother-in-law, brother9 in-law, sister-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, grandparent,
10 or grandchild or a person residing in the voter's household may
11 mail or deliver the application to the clerk for the applicant.

(d) If an applicant cannot return the application in any of the above methods, the applicant may select any registered elector to return the application. The person returning the application must sign and return the certificate at the bottom of the application.

(7) A person who prints and distributes absent voter ballot
applications shall print on the application the warning,
certificate of authorized registered elector returning absent
voter ballot application, and instructions required by this
section.

(8) A person who makes a false statement in an absent voter
ballot application is guilty of a misdemeanor. A person who
forges a signature on an absent voter ballot application is
guilty of a felony. A person who is not authorized in this act
and who both distributes absent voter ballot applications to
absent voters and returns those absent voter ballot applications

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1 to a clerk or assistant of the clerk is guilty of a misdemeanor.
