HOUSE BILL No. 6061

May 23, 2018, Introduced by Rep. VanSingel and referred to the Committee on Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 1980 PA 299, entitled

"Occupational code,"

by amending sections 1101, 1108, 1110, and 1113 (MCL 339.1101, 339.1108, 339.1110, and 339.1113), sections 1101 and 1113 as amended by 1984 PA 25, section 1108 as amended by 2014 PA 136, and section 1110 as amended by 2014 PA 137, and by adding sections 1107 and 1111a.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 1101. As used in this article:

(A) "APPRENTICE" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS LEARNING THE THEORY AND PRACTICE OF SERVING AS A BARBER IN A BARBERSHOP.

(B) (a) "Barber" means a person AN INDIVIDUAL who shaves or

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1 trims the beard of a person; AN INDIVIDUAL; cuts, trims, shampoos, 2 relaxes, curls, permanently waves, dresses, tints, bleaches, 3 colors, arranges, or styles the hair of a person; AN INDIVIDUAL; 4 massages the face and head of a person; AN INDIVIDUAL; or renders 5 PERFORMS personal services of a similar nature THAT ARE customarily 6 done by a barber.

7 (C) (b) "Barber college" means an establishment which renders
8 THAT PROVIDES for compensation the services of a barber, but having
9 for HAS AS its primary purpose the teaching for compensation of the
10 theory and practice of serving as a barber.

(D) (c) "Barbershop" means a place, establishment, or premises or part of a premises where a person AT LEAST 1 INDIVIDUAL performs as a barber.

14 (E) (d) "Demonstration" means a show, seminar, or contest in
15 which barber services are rendered PERFORMED for the purpose of
16 educating barbers.

17 (F) (e) "Demonstrator" means a person AN INDIVIDUAL who
18 performs a service of a barber at a demonstration.

(G) (f) "Immediate family" means persons INDIVIDUALS residing
 together who are related by birth, marriage, or adoption.

(H) (g) "Instructor" means a person AN INDIVIDUAL who
 instructs another in the theory and practice of serving as a barber

23 IN A BARBER COLLEGE.

24 (I) (h) "Student" means a person AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS learning
25 the theory and practice of serving as a barber IN A BARBER COLLEGE.

26 (J) (i) "Student instructor" means a person AN INDIVIDUAL WHO
27 IS learning the theory and practice of teaching barbering.

SEC. 1107. (1) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ISSUE AN APPRENTICE
 STUDENT LICENSE TO AN INDIVIDUAL WHO MEETS ALL OF THE FOLLOWING
 REQUIREMENTS:

4 (A) HAS COMPLETED THE TENTH GRADE OF SCHOOL OR HAS AN 5 EQUIVALENT EDUCATION AS DETERMINED BY THE DEPARTMENT.

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(B) IS OF GOOD MORAL CHARACTER.

7 (2) AN APPRENTICE WHO HOLDS A LICENSE UNDER THIS SECTION MAY
8 PERFORM BARBER SERVICES TO THE PUBLIC UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF A
9 LICENSED BARBER.

10 (3) THE TERM OF AN APPRENTICE LICENSE IS 2 YEARS. AN
11 APPRENTICE MAY RENEW HIS OR HER LICENSE FOR 1 ADDITIONAL YEAR. AN
12 EXTENSION OF AN APPRENTICE LICENSE BEYOND THAT PROVIDED FOR IN THIS
13 SUBSECTION REQUIRES APPROVAL BY THE BOARD.

14 (4) WITH THE DEPARTMENT'S APPROVAL, AN INDIVIDUAL WHO HAS
15 PREVIOUSLY HELD AN APPRENTICE STUDENT LICENSE MAY BE GRANTED A NEW
16 APPRENTICE LICENSE OR MAY TRANSFER AN APPRENTICE LICENSE TO ANOTHER
17 BARBERSHOP.

18 Sec. 1108. (1) The department shall issue a license to
19 practice as a barber to an individual who fulfills MEETS all of the
20 following requirements:

21 (a) Is not less than AT LEAST 17 years of age.

22 (b) Is of good moral character.

23 (c) Demonstrates 1 OF THE FOLLOWING:

24 (i) SUBJECT TO SUBSECTIONS (3) AND (4), satisfactory

25 completion of not less than a 1,800-hour course of study AN

26 EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM at a licensed barber college THAT PROVIDES AT

27 LEAST 1,500 HOURS OF INSTRUCTION THAT INCLUDES CLASSROOM STUDY,

1 DEMONSTRATIONS, AND PRACTICAL BARBER TRAINING.

2 (*ii*) HAS SERVED AS AN APPRENTICE FOR AT LEAST 2 YEARS IN A
3 LICENSED BARBERSHOP. THE TRAINING MUST INCLUDE THE MINIMUM NUMBER
4 OF PRACTICAL APPLICATIONS REQUIRED BY RULE.

5 (d) Passes an examination approved by the board and the6 department.

7 (e) Has completed the tenth grade of school or has an8 equivalent education as determined by the department.

9 (2) The department shall issue a license as a barber to an individual who has held a license as a barber in another state, 10 11 jurisdiction, or country for 1 out of the 3 years immediately 12 preceding the date of application if the requirements for licensure 13 in the other state, jurisdiction, or country are substantially 14 equivalent to the requirements of subsection (1), as determined by the department. However, the department may deny or limit a license 15 16 if the applicant has been disciplined or disciplinary action is 17 pending in another state, jurisdiction, or country.

18 (3) For the purposes of fulfilling the requirement of MEETING 19 subsection (1)(c), (1)(C)(i), an individual whose instruction as a 20 barber was received in another state, jurisdiction, or country may 21 substitute experience as a barber or barber apprentice for 22 instruction in the ratio of 3 months of experience for 100 hours of 23 instruction. However, if his or her experience as a barber or 24 barber apprentice was acquired in a country that the department 25 considers a country from which records are not generally available, 26 both of the following apply to the substitution of experience for 27 instruction under this subsection:

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(a) He or she may not substitute experience for instruction
 under this subsection unless he or she provides a signed and
 notarized attestation detailing his or her experience, including
 his or her place of employment or apprenticeship, to the
 department.

6 (b) He or she may not substitute experience for any of the
7 hours of instruction concerning safety and sanitation, or
8 concerning laws, rules, and regulations, required by the department
9 by rules promulgated under this article.

(4) FOR THE PURPOSES OF MEETING SUBSECTION (1)(C)(i), AN 10 11 INDIVIDUAL WHO HAS RECEIVED TRAINING AS A BARBER APPRENTICE MAY SUBSTITUTE TRAINING AS A BARBER APPRENTICE FOR PRACTICAL BARBER 12 TRAINING IN A BARBER COLLEGE PROGRAM AT A RATIO OF 1 HOUR OF 13 APPRENTICESHIP TRAINING FOR 1 HOUR OF PRACTICAL BARBER TRAINING. 14 ALL OF THE FOLLOWING APPLY TO THE SUBSTITUTION OF APPRENTICESHIP 15 TRAINING FOR PRACTICAL BARBER TRAINING IN A BARBER COLLEGE PROGRAM 16 UNDER THIS SUBSECTION: 17

18 (A) HE OR SHE MAY NOT SUBSTITUTE MORE THAN 500 HOURS OF
19 APPRENTICESHIP TRAINING FOR HOURS OF PRACTICAL BARBER TRAINING.
20 (B) HE OR SHE MAY ONLY SUBSTITUTE HOURS OF APPRENTICESHIP
21 TRAINING PERFORMED UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF A LICENSED BARBER FOR
22 HOURS OF PRACTICAL BARBER TRAINING.

(C) HE OR SHE MAY NOT SUBSTITUTE HOURS OF APPRENTICESHIP
TRAINING FOR PRACTICAL BARBER TRAINING UNLESS HE OR SHE PROVIDES A
SIGNED AND NOTARIZED ATTESTATION DETAILING HIS OR HER TRAINING,
INCLUDING HIS OR HER PLACE OF APPRENTICESHIP, TO THE BARBER COLLEGE
AND DEPARTMENT.

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(D) HE OR SHE MAY NOT SUBSTITUTE APPRENTICESHIP TRAINING FOR
 ANY OF THE HOURS OF INSTRUCTION CONCERNING SAFETY AND SANITATION,
 OR CONCERNING LAWS, RULES, AND REGULATIONS, REQUIRED BY THE
 DEPARTMENT BY RULES PROMULGATED UNDER THIS ARTICLE.

5 (E) THE BARBERSHOP CONDUCTING THE APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM IS
6 LOCATED IN THIS STATE.

7 Sec. 1110. (1) The department shall license a barber college8 that meets all of the following requirements:

9 (a) Through its owners or managers, has applied to the10 department for a license.

(b) Provides an educational program requiring completion of
225 hours of classroom study, demonstrations, and recitations and
13 1,575-1,275 hours of practical barber training.

14 (c) Meets the sanitation standards required of barbershops as
15 set forth in rules promulgated by the board and determined by
16 inspection by the department.

17 (d) Files and maintains a corporate surety or cash bond of
18 \$10,000.00 conditioned on the faithful performance and satisfaction
19 of the contractual rights of students enrolled in the barber
20 college.

(e) Employs or contracts with not fewer than 2 full-time,
licensed instructors and ensures that both of the following are
met:

24 (i) At any time classroom study or theory training is given to
25 any number of students, at least 1 instructor is present.

26 (*ii*) If practical training occurs, there is at least 1
27 instructor present for every 30 students at all times.

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(f) Is completely partitioned from any other place of business
 or dwelling. A person shall not conduct any other business from a
 barber college than the rendering of barber services and the
 teaching of barbering, although a barber college may sell at retail
 to patrons those preparations used on patrons who are receiving
 barbering services from students.

7 (q) Provides reasonable classroom facilities and other equipment for the proper instruction of students described in this 8 subdivision and rules promulgated by the board, including 1 9 stationary wash basin with hot and cold running water and a 10 11 connected drain for every 2 barber chairs. A barber college shall 12 arrange its enrollment and course scheduling so that students are not required to share the use of a training station during any 13 14 practical training period.

15 (2) Except as provided in this subsection, a student 16 instructor may not instruct without a supervising instructor 17 present in the room. In case of emergency, a student instructor may instruct up to 30 students, but the barber college shall provide 18 19 notice of the emergency to the department in writing and ensure 20 that an instructor is on the premises at all times. Use of a 21 student instructor as a substitute instructor under this subsection 22 shall not continue for more than 7 consecutive days without written 23 approval of the department certifying the emergency circumstances.

(3) The license of a barber college is automatically revoked
if there is a transfer of ownership or change of location of a
barber college. The department shall not grant a new license to new
owners or for a new location unless the requirements of subsection

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1 (1) are met.

2 (4) The classroom courses of a barber college shall include at least all of the following: scientific fundamentals for barbering; 3 4 hygiene; bacteriology; histology of hair, skin, and nails; structure of the head, face, and neck, including muscles and 5 nerves; elementary chemistry relating to sterilization and 6 7 antiseptics; diseases of the skin, hair, glands, and nails; massaging and manipulating the head, face, and neck; haircutting 8 9 and shaving; cosmetic therapy; arranging, styling, dressing, 10 coloring, bleaching, curling, permanent waving, and tinting of the 11 hair; elements of business training; and barber laws and rules of 12 the state.

(5) The department by rule shall prescribe the number of hours
of instruction a barber college is required to provide for each
subject set forth in subsection (4). Each barber college shall
provide a written copy of the rules to each student at the
beginning of his or her instruction.

(6) A barber college shall display the license of the barber
college and all instructors, student instructors, and students in a
prominent place visible to the public at all times. An individual's
license may be displayed at the individual's work station.

22 SEC. 1111A. (1) A BARBERSHOP THAT CHARGES A FEE FOR TEACHING 23 BARBER SERVICES IS CONSIDERED A BARBER COLLEGE AND IS REQUIRED TO 24 COMPLY WITH SECTION 1110. A BARBERSHOP THAT CONDUCTS AN 25 APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM WITHOUT CHARGING A FEE FOR TEACHING BARBER 26 SERVICES MUST COMPLY WITH SUBSECTION (2).

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(2) A BARBERSHOP THAT CONDUCTS AN APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM MUST

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1 COMPLY WITH ALL OF THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS:

2 (A) REQUIRE THAT AN APPRENTICE IS IN ATTENDANCE NOT MORE THAN
3 7 HOURS PER DAY OR NOT MORE THAN 40 HOURS PER WEEK.

4 (B) KEEP A DAILY RECORD OF THE ATTENDANCE OF EACH APPRENTICE,
5 AND SEND A COPY OF THOSE RECORDS TO THE DEPARTMENT MONTHLY;
6 ESTABLISH GRADES; AND REQUIRE AN APPRENTICE TO PASS AN EXAMINATION
7 BEFORE CERTIFYING TO THE DEPARTMENT THAT HE OR SHE HAS COMPLETED
8 TRAINING.

9 (C) PERMIT AN APPRENTICE TO PRACTICE ON THE PUBLIC ONLY AFTER 10 COMPLETING AT LEAST 350 HOURS OF INSTRUCTION.

(3) A BARBERSHOP THAT HAS SUCCESSFULLY TRAINED 1
APPRENTICE IS ELIGIBLE TO TRAIN ADDITIONAL APPRENTICES, EXCEPT THAT
A BARBERSHOP SHALL NOT HAVE MORE THAN 2 APPRENTICES AT THE SAME
TIME.

(4) AT THE TIME IT ACCEPTS AN INDIVIDUAL FOR APPRENTICESHIP
TRAINING, A BARBERSHOP SHALL FILE AN APPLICATION WITH THE
DEPARTMENT AND SHALL OBTAIN PROOF THE INDIVIDUAL MEETS THE
EDUCATIONAL REQUIREMENT DESCRIBED IN SECTION 1107(1)(A). THE
BARBERSHOP MUST RETAIN A COPY OF THE APPLICATION AND THE PROOF OF
EDUCATION UNTIL THE APPRENTICE APPLIES FOR EXAMINATION TO OBTAIN A
LICENSE.

Sec. 1113. (1) Following the initial inspection required to
open a barbershop or barber college, AND EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE
PROVIDED IN THIS SUBSECTION, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL INSPECT each
barbershop shall be inspected at least once a year, and ANNUALLY.
THE DEPARTMENT SHALL INSPECT each barber college shall be inspected
twice a year. AND BARBERSHOP THAT IS TRAINING APPRENTICES AT LEAST

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1 TWICE ANNUALLY.

(2) A board member or representative of the department shall
be-IS allowed to enter the premises during regular business hours
for the purpose of inspecting to determine that the barbershop or
barber college meets the requirements of this article and rules
promulgated under this article.

7 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days8 after the date it is enacted into law.
