SUMMARY:

House Bill 5827 would amend the Public Health Code to allow hours of clinical practice performed out of state to count toward the requirements for licensure as a dental therapist.

2018 PA 463 provided for the licensure of dental therapists and prescribed their scope of practice.¹ Currently, to be licensed as a dental therapist, a person must apply to the Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs (LARA), pay the application fee, and demonstrate that he or she meets all of the following:

- Has graduated from a dental therapy education program that meets the applicable accreditation requirements and any other requirements for dental therapy education programs adopted by the Board of Dentistry.
- Has passed a comprehensive, competency-based clinical examination approved by LARA that includes an examination of the applicant's knowledge of Michigan's laws and rules concerning dentistry.
- Has completed 500 hours of supervised clinical practice under the direct supervision of a dentist and in conformity with rules adopted by the Board of Dentistry.

The bill would amend the third requirement bulleted above to provide that the 500 hours of supervised clinical practice could include hours of supervised clinical practice performed in another state under the direct supervision of an individual authorized under the laws of that state to engage in the practice of dentistry.
