> SENATE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 5315

A bill to amend 1998 PA 58, entitled "Michigan liquor control code of 1998,"

by amending section 513 (MCL 436.1513), as amended by 2020 PA 39.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 513. (1) The commission may issue to the governing board of a college or university, without regard to the quota provisions 2 3 of section 531, a license to sell alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises of a conference center operated by the governing 4 board. Licenses granted under this subsection may be used only for 5 the sale of alcoholic liquor at regularly scheduled conference 6 7 center activities. The sale of alcoholic liquor to unscheduled patrons or at unscheduled events is prohibited under this 8 subsection. 9

(2) Subject to section 531, the commission may issue a license
 to a private entity for the sale of alcoholic liquor for
 consumption on the premises of a hotel located on land owned by
 Central Michigan University if both of the following circumstances
 exist:

5 (5) Subject to section 531, the commission may issue to the 6 governing board of Northern Michigan University a license for the 7 sale of alcoholic liquor for consumption on the licensed premises 8 of a restaurant located on land owned and operated by Northern 9 Michigan University if both of the following apply:

10 (a) The license was originally acquired on the open market at11 fair market value.

(b) The restaurant is located within an area designated for
community development or conference activities by the governing
board of Northern Michigan University.

15 (6) (5) Subject to section 531, the commission may issue a 16 license to a golf course clubhouse and any adjacent outdoor service 17 area owned or operated by a college or university for the sale of 18 alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises of the golf course 19 clubhouse and any adjacent outdoor service area.
