A resolution to commemorate the celebration of the 75th
 anniversary of the Michigan Association for Justice and express
 appreciation for the organization's contributions to promoting and
 protecting a fair and effective justice system in Michigan and
 safeguarding the 7th Amendment of the United States Constitution.



Whereas, It is an honor for the members of the Michigan 1 Legislature to join in saluting the Michigan Association for 2 Justice (MAJ) as it marks 75 years of service in jurisprudence. 3 This renowned group was formed in 1945 with approximately twenty 4 5 lawyers who were specialists in workers' compensation. Mr. Sam 6 Charfoos served as the first president of the organization which is 7 dedicated to ensuring access to the civil justice system and 8 defending our cherished right to a civil trial by jury; and

9 Whereas, The 7th Amendment to the United States Constitution 10 grants every American the right to a civil trial by jury. Over the 11 years, members of MAJ have fought courageously to protect the 12 rights of consumers, workers, children, and families from powerful 13 forces aligned against them. Trial lawyers are champions for 14 vulnerable people who would otherwise have no voice; and

15 Whereas, The Constitution of Michigan of 1963, Article 1, 16 Section 14, states that "The right of [civil] trial by jury shall remain." We applaud the efforts of MAJ members to keep the justice 17 system fair and open. Through effective efforts on behalf of 18 innocent victims, civil rights, and equal rights, many people have 19 20 gained access to justice, and many others have been protected by the precedents that certain of these cases have set. The 21 accomplishments of the Michigan Association for Justice in 22 23 fulfilling its mission of promoting and protecting a fair and 24 effective justice system and ensuring that any person who is 25 injured by the misconduct or negligence of others can obtain justice in Michigan's courtrooms stand as a bulwark against 26 27 unfairness, inequity, and injustice. Its 75 years of vigilance and 28 attainment gives great significance to this notable milestone in 29 MAJ history; now, therefore, be it
