- (6) Not later than 10 days after the legislature convenes in January of 1982, and in every odd numbered year, thereafter, the governor shall transmit to the legislature a full employment plan which meets the requirements prescribed as described in subsections (2) and (3).
- (7) Each state department shall cooperate and assist the department of labor and economic opportunity in the collection and analysis of collecting and analyzing data and in—advising of on priorities and recommended courses of action to achieve the goals and objectives set forth in the biennial employment plan under subsection (6) and the annual report required by subsection (1).
