## **HOUSE BILL NO. 5018**

June 15, 2021, Introduced by Reps. Brabec, Yancey, Weiss, Brenda Carter, Thanedar, Cynthia Johnson, Young, Rabhi and Kuppa and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to amend 1965 PA 203, entitled "Michigan commission on law enforcement standards act," by amending section 9e (MCL 28.609e), as added by 2018 PA 552.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 9e. (1) Beginning January 1, 2020, an individual seeking
- 2 to become licensed under section 9, 9b, 9c, or 9d shall complete
- 3 active violence response training that emphasizes coordinated
- 4 tactical response to rapidly developing incidents in which
- 5 intentional physical injury or death to a specific population

- 1 occurs through the use of conventional or unconventional weapons
- 2 and tactics.
- 3 (2) The commission shall promulgate rules establishing the
- 4 minimum standards for the active violence response training
- 5 required under subsection (1).
- 6 (3) Beginning January 1, 2020, an individual who is licensed
- 7 under section 9, 9b, 9c, or 9d shall complete the active violence
- 8 response training described under subsection (1).
- 9 (4) Beginning January 1, 2022, an individual seeking to become
- 10 licensed under section 9, 9b, 9c, or 9d shall complete crisis
- 11 intervention team training that is designed to assist law
- 12 enforcement officers in responding to an individual with mental
- 13 illness and in identifying warning signs of mental illness in other
- 14 law enforcement officers.
- 15 (5) The commission shall promulgate rules establishing the
- 16 minimum standards for the training required under subsection (4),
- 17 which must include training on all of the following:
- 18 (a) A history of the mental health system.
- 19 (b) The signs, symptoms, common treatments, and medications
- 20 for various mental illnesses, including, but not limited to, post-
- 21 traumatic stress disorder.
- 22 (c) Potential interactions with an individual with mental
- 23 illness, and potential interactions with family members and service
- 24 providers of an individual with mental illness.
- 25 (d) De-escalation techniques.
