## HOUSE RESOLUTION NO.64

Reps. Anthony, Pohutsky, Brenda Carter, Young, Cavanagh, Clemente, Kuppa, Brixie, Stone, Bolden, Morse, Brabec, Hope, Tyrone Carter, Weiss, Lasinski, Sowerby, Hood, Haadsma, Hammoud, Aiyash, Sabo, Breen, Cherry, Garza and Sneller offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to declare March 24, 2021, as Pay Equity Day in 2 the state of Michigan.
- 3 Whereas, It has been 58 years since the passage of the Equal
- 4 Pay Act and even with the passage of Title VII of the Civil Rights
- 5 Act just one year later, women and people of color continue to
- 6 suffer the consequences of inequitable pay differentials; and
- 7 Whereas, Equal Pay Day takes place on the day of the year on
- 8 which the earnings of women catch up to the average earnings of
- 9 men. The calculation is based on the 2019 US Census data on median

- 1 earnings for full-time, year-round workers. Women on average make
- 2 \$0.82 compared to one dollar for men on average in the United
- 3 States; and
- 4 Whereas, Pay discrimination also heavily impacts women in
- 5 other ethnic and racial groups, with significant disparities seen
- 6 for Black, Native American, Latina, and Asian American and Pacific
- 7 Islander women; and
- 8 Whereas, Over a working lifetime, wage disparity costs
- 9 the average American woman and her family, impacting retirement
- 10 savings programs, Social Security benefits, and pensions. This has
- 11 contributed to an overarching wealth gap between men and women,
- 12 with women owning only \$0.32 for every dollar owned by men; and
- 13 Whereas, Ongoing wage disparities for women are further
- 14 exacerbated by significant shocks to the economy, such as the
- 15 COVID-19 pandemic. Labor force participation among women in
- 16 Michigan fell nearly 6 percent during the COVID-19 pandemic
- 17 compared to less than 1 percent for men, furthering wage and wealth
- 18 inequality. Economic forecasters estimate the COVID-19 pandemic
- 19 will likely lead to significant challenges for women in the labor
- 20 market in the future, including lower wages and fewer job
- 21 opportunities; and
- 22 Whereas, Pay discrimination based on any factor is wrong.
- 23 Employees should be compensated by their employers based solely on
- 24 their merits; and
- Whereas, Fair pay strengthens the security of families today
- 26 and eases future retirement costs while enhancing the American
- 27 economy; now, therefore, be it
- Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of
- 29 this legislative body declare March 24, 2021, as Pay Equity Day in

- 1 the state of Michigan. We urge Michigan's citizens to recognize the
- 2 full value of women's skills and significant contributions to the
- 3 labor force.
