She remains an active member of the Delta Sigma 10 Theta Sorority, and she is excited for the opportunity to continue 11 to serve her community as a Thirty-Sixth District Court judge after 12 leaving the Legislature; and

13 Whereas, Since her election to the House of Representatives in 14 2017, Representative Yancey drew on her personal experiences to 15 become an advocate for the hardworking people in the First 16 District. She served on the Joint Task Force on Jail and Pretrial Incarceration, which saw many of its recommendations become 17 18 legislation.
