HOUSE RESOLUTION NO.37

Reps. Cynthia Johnson and Rabhi offered the following resolution:

A resolution to urge Congress to pass legislation that
 prohibits water shutoffs, requires reconnection, and ensures water
 affordability during the COVID-19 national emergency.

Whereas, Millions of Americans lack running water in their
homes due to service shutoffs driven by exorbitant rates and
unaffordable bills. While water shutoffs are prevalent in all 50
states, shutoffs disproportionately impact cities with higher rates
of poverty, unemployment, and people of color; and

Whereas, Access to running water is essential to maintain
proper hygiene and to help prevent the transmission of COVID-19.
Regular handwashing is one of the best ways to remove germs, avoid

12 getting sick, and prevent the spread of germs; and

Whereas, Although many municipalities and states, including 1 Michigan, have issued moratoriums on water shutoffs for nonpayment 2 during the COVID-19 crisis, we must ensure a comprehensive federal 3 response that protects all households; and 4 5 Whereas, The Emergency Water is a Human Right Act (H.R. 616) 6 has been introduced in Congress to prohibit water shutoffs to all 7 households during the COVID-19 emergency period. If passed, it 8 would ensure water affordability protections for households with 9 incomes up to 150 percent of the federal poverty level by providing 10 grants to states so that they may provide drinking water and 11 wastewater assistance to low-income households; and 12 Whereas, No person living in the United States should be 13 forced to live without access to running water, especially during a 14 pandemic. Every effort should be made at all levels of government 15 to ensure people are able to protect themselves from COVID-19; now, 16 therefore, be it 17 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That we urge 18 Congress to pass legislation that prohibits water shutoffs, 19 requires reconnection, and ensures water affordability during the 20 COVID-19 national emergency; and be it further 21 Resolved, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to the 22 President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United 23 States House of Representatives, and the members of the Michigan 24 congressional delegation.
