4. Describe the general purpose of these rules, including any problem(s) the changes are intended to address:

Public Act 138 of 2014 was repealed and replaced by 2018 PA 337, which is known as the Improved Workforce Opportunity Wage Act. The goal of this rule set is to revise the Wage and Hour Division General Rules in order to comply with 2018 PA 337.

Section 6 of the 2018 PA 337, permits the Commissioner, meaning the Director of the Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs as defined in Section 2(a), MCL 408.932(a) of Public Act 337, to promulgate rules under the Administrative Procedures Act that are necessary for the administration of Public Act 337.
