OSHA's deadline for MIOSHA to adopt these amendment is July 25, 2019. The federal standards took effect on February 25, 2019.

9. Describe the general purpose of these rules, including any problem(s) the changes are intended to address:

MIOSHA Safety and Health Standard Part 11 Recording and Reporting of Occupational Injuries and Illnesses gives direction to employers and employees on the recording and reporting of occupational injuries and illnesses to comply with federal requirements.

These rules are being amended due to the recently revised federal regulation 1904.41, in order to be at least as effective as the federal Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) standards.

In addition, minor editorial and formatting changes are being made.

5. Cite the specific rule promulgation authority (i.e. agency director, commission, board, etc., listing all applicable statutory references. If the rule(s) are mandated by any applicable constitutional or statutory provision, please explain.

The Williams-Steiger Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 requires MIOSHA to promulgate standards that are 'at least as effective as' those promulgated under Section 69 of the Act, as amended, being MCL 408.1069.

6. Describe the extent to which the rule(s) conflict with, duplicate, or exceed similar regulations, compliance requirements, or other standards adopted at the state, regional, or federal level. Include applicable public act and statutory references.

These rules are similar to 29 C.F.R. 1904 “Recording and Reporting Occupational Injuries and Illness.”
