John Mandelaris said in an email to The Flint Journal that his term as chairman of the commission ends Dec. 31, and he hasn't taken any actions on his own.

"The five-member board acts as a unit and no individual member can set policy under 1951 Public Act 51," Mandelaris wrote in the email. "Therefore, if the ... members of the County Board (of Commissioners) who voted to commence removal proceedings because they are unhappy with the ongoing road commission activities ... should target the entire fivemember Board of Road Commissioners for removal."

County commissioners voted 7-2 in November for its attorneys to take the steps necessary to remove Mandelaris and Vice Chairman Robert Johnson from office after some commissioners said they have lost faith in the pair's leadership.

Mandelaris' email says anyone who wants new leadership of the commission only has to wait a month and it will happen on its own after his and Johnson's terms as chairman and vice chairman expire.

Johnson declined to comment on the potential hearing to remove him from office when reached by The Journal on Tuesday.

County commissioners Brenda Clack and Bryant Nolden, both Flint Democrats, have voted against moving forward with the attempted removals.

County commissioners appoint the five members of the road commission, which oversees the construction and maintenance of county roads and bridges and the administration of funds from gas and weight taxes.


