The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) recognizes the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic for nursing facilities (NF) and is fully committed to working closely with NFs during this time. The Care and Recovery Centers are essential to the MDHHS strategy for addressing the pandemic. The CRCs are described in bulletin MSA 20-72. Policy bulletins and letters are located at www.michigan.gov/medicaidproviders >> Policy, Letters & Forms.

The purpose of this bulletin is to address the application of the 85% occupancy limitation to CRCs. See the Michigan Medicaid Provider Manual, Nursing Facility Chapter, Cost Reporting and Reimbursement Appendix, Section 2, Definitions, Per Resident Day Cost. The Manual is located on the MDHHS website at www.michigan.gov/medicaidproviders >> Policy, Letters & Forms >> Medicaid Provider Manual. For dates that a NF is designated as a CRC, the 85% occupancy limitation will not be applied to the distinct CRC unit, but will continue to apply to areas of the NF not part of the CRC unit.

Additional guidance from the Long-Term Care Reimbursement and Rate Setting Section will be forthcoming on how this will be addressed on the Medicaid NF cost report.
