The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) is pursuing an amendment to its Medicaid State Plan to add a family planning Medicaid group (Plan First) that will provide coverage for family planning services for people with incomes up to 195 percent of the federal poverty level (currently \$35,704 annually for a household of two). Under the change, approximately 25,000 additional Michigan residents would have access to these critically important family planning services.

To be eligible for this group an individual must:

- Have income at or below 195% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) under the Modified Adjusted Gross Income (MAGI) methodology;
- Not be pregnant at the time of application;
- Be a resident of the state of Michigan; and
- Meet Medicaid citizenship and immigration requirements.

There are no gender or age requirements to be eligible for Plan First.
