**FISCAL IMPACT:**

**State:**

Enactment of this rule would have a minor negative fiscal impact on the Department of Health and Human Services. The Department has indicated that federal grants available from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention will be used to cover the cost of implementing this rule.

**Local:**

This rule would have an indeterminate negative fiscal impact on local units of government resulting from the requirement of collecting and managing data related to poisonings due to the use of prescription or illicit drugs. The Department indicates that by collecting more thorough data, local units of government will be better able to qualify for and obtain federal grants, offsetting some of the implementation costs. However, this will only offset costs in the long-term, while short-term costs will be borne entirely by the local unit of government.
