This hearing is being conducted under authority provided to the Director in Section 7(b) of Act 94 of 2018, the Seed Potato Act. The proposed rules are to regulate distribution and planting of seed

potatoes that meet the requirements of certified seed in the Certification of Seed Act, 1959 Public Act 221, and the rules promulgated under that Act. These new rules, required by Act 94 of 2018, will regulate exceptions that would allow farmers to plant uncertified seed in instances where there are insufficient volumes of any cultivar of certified seed potatoes and on lots of one acre or greater.
