The Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs will hold a public hearing to receive public comments on proposed changes to the Respiratory Care - General Rules rule set.

The proposed rules will add a telehealth rule; remove the working knowledge of the English language rule; clarify the requirements for licensure by endorsement; update accreditation standards; and clarify relicensure requirements.

MCL 333.16145, 333.16148, 333.16174, 333.16287, and 333.18709, and Executive Reorganization Order Nos. 1991-9, 1996-2, 2003-1, and 2011-4, MCL 338.3501, 445.2001, 445.2011, and 445.2030. These rules will take effect Immediately after filing with the Secretary of State.
