Out into the distance, the

long, dirt road wound, wet and slick reminding me of some colossal, brown ser-pent whose head and tail I

That vote prompted lawsuits asking courts to send the commissioners back to the drawing board.

Two of those lawsuits are ongoing. One alleges that the commission's state legislative maps illegally disenfranchise Black voters concentrated in Detroit. Another alleges that the new congressional map includes unacceptable population differences between districts.

At a meeting in August, commissioners adopted a draft budget to present to lawmakers requesting supplemental funds for the 2023 fiscal year. It included a proposed reduction in commissioners' salaries from \$55,755 to \$39,825.

In an Aug. 18 letter to the leaders of the appropriations committees in the state Legislature, Woods asked lawmakers to approve additional funds for the commission to help cover its legal fees in the two pending cases against the new maps.

The commission's lawyers concluded in a recent memo on the group's operations after approving maps that the commissioners' terms conclude when any pending lawsuits challenging the commission's work come to an end.

The Michigan Constitution states, "The terms of the commissioners shall expire once the commission has completed its obligations for a census cycle but not before any judicial review of the redistricting plan is complete."
