Thank you, all, for the 1 MR. MARTINEZ: 2 opportunity. My name is Aaron Martinez. I am here on 3 behalf of the Nichols Law Firm speaking on my own behalf and on behalf of Mike Nichols and the attorneys at our 4 5 office. We've had an opportunity to look at the breath 6 7 alcohol rules, the proposed rules. I won't belabor it because Mr. Nichols did submit his comments in writing 8 today, but a few points that we just wanted to bring up. 9 Number one, this instrument that the department 10 is -- is considering, the Intox 9000, we've learned from 11 other jurisdictions that the instrument has the 12 capability to have the histograms printed on the subject 13 sample tickets. 14 And we would just put forth that -- that we 15 16 think it's probably a good practice to -- to mandate that 17 those be included. It helps the officers who are administering the tests to know that they are properly 18 being -- or that the sample is properly received by the 19 machine, and as well as provides an opportunity if there 20 21 is an -- an issue, for the subject to give another sample if need be. 22 23 And secondly, just to note on calibration, we were a little bit concerned that the -- the timeline 24

seems to be a little bit longer with this particular

1	machine.
2	We had concerns a few years ago about the
3	the calibrations obviously, that were happening with the
4	DataMaster machines throughout the state, and and we
5	think everybody is in a position where we want to avoid
6	any more of those types of controversies.
7	So, we would just simply ask that the
8	calibration happen more frequently and rather than
9	less frequently as it seems that the the current rule
10	as they are right now would mandate.
11	So, those would just be my comments and we
12	would rely on Mr. Nichols' submitted comments as well.
13	MR. BEATTY: So, if I could ask and you
14	don't have to answer my question, but we want to make
15	sure. The record is open until 5:00 today. Are you
16	aware if Mr. Nichols emailed those to the
17	MSPForensics@Michigan.gov
18	MR. MARTINEZ: Yes.
19	MR. BEATTY: or if he mailed them?
20	MR. MARTINEZ: Yeah, he emailed them, I
21	believe, probably around 11:30 this morning.
22	MR. BEATTY: Okay. So, we will look out for
23	those and make sure they came they come in. And I
24	don't know if there is a way to check that before, but
25	we'll we'll keep an eye out for those.

1	MR. MARTINEZ: Great. Well, we appreciate the
2	opportunity, and thanks for holding the hearing.
3	MR. BEATTY: No no problem. Thank you very
4	much. You have a good day.
5	MR. MARTINEZ: You as well. Thank you.



My name is Mike Nichols.

I make these comments and suggestions on my own behalf. For purposes of introduction, I have been practicing law for over 23 years. For the last 15 years I have devoted a substantial amount of my practice to the law and science of Operating While Intoxicated (OWI). I have taught as an adjunct professor of Forensic Science in Criminal Law as well as DUI Law and Practice at WMU Cooley Law School.

I am a member of the Criminal Defense Attorneys of Michigan and serve on the Rules and Laws Committee. I am the co-chair of the Task Force for Forensic Evidence for the National College for DUI Defense and I am a sustaining member of the NCDD and also a faculty member.

With respect to the proposed rules:

#### General:

• The rules should require that every instrument print the breath alcohol histogram and a flow chart with every subject sample. The point is to assess the flow rate and alcohol curve as a function of time of each and every subject sample. The instrument has this capability. It is vital in order to ascertain if the instrument accepted a sample of breath alcohol when the parameters of volume, flow rate and alcohol curve did not indicate a proper sample. This data also helps ascertain if some other interferent may have been present. Failing to provide this to individuals is tantamount to hiding evidence.

325.2653(2) and (3):

• It is not very clear to my reading, but the 120 calibration checks and weekly accuracy checks should be required whether an air blank is generated during the subject test sequence or not. We are 3 years removed from a complete failure of our breath alcohol measurement system because calibrations were purportedly completed in a fraudulent manner. If I read these proposed sub-rules correctly, a scenario under which no 120 day calibration inspections or weekly accuracy checks are required at all is permissible under these rules. That creates a very high risk of instrument failures without either law enforcement, tested subjects or the criminal justice community to realize an instrument is failing or unreliable.

325.2654:

This sub-rule appears to be rescinded. It should not be rescinded because it requires that if an
instrument is repaired, it must undergo a certification inspection and be verified for accuracy in
accordance with a 120 day calibration inspection process.

General

 Defense attorneys should have the right under the rules to inspect the instrument at the agency with an expert witness so long as the attorney and expert are accompanied by an employee of the police department. Please write this process into the rule.
