3. Purpose for the proposed rules and background:

The purpose of the Board of Nursing Rules is to regulate the prelicensure education, licensure, specialty certification, licensure renewal, relicensure, continuing education for licensed nurses, and the nursing professional fund scholarship program.

The proposed rules are intended to address the requirements to take the NCLEX examination; clarify the nursing education program requirements; modify the nurse professional fund scholarship program requirements; clarify continuing education requirements; modify the nurse specialty certification requirements; and address licensure requirements.

4. Summary of proposed rules:

The proposed rules include the following changes:

General Provisions and Licensure: updates to comply with current drafting standards; clarification of the process for licensure verification; recognition of a nursing education program accredited by the Canadian Association of Schools of Nursing; allowing another state board of nursing to attest that an unaccredited closed program, in that state, was in good standing when the program closed; requiring an applicant to pass the NCLEX within 1 year of obtaining a skills competency evaluation; omitting the curriculum review of an endorsement applicant who has been licensed for 5 years without discipline; and easing the licensure requirements for Canadian applicants for endorsement.

Nursing Education Programs: clarification of the self-study content requirements; clarification that a program may not enroll students until all site visit deficiencies have been rectified; clarification of reporting requirements and the content of major program changes and requests for seat increases; provision of a process to handle programs that lose accreditation; adoption of the most recent standards of the International Nursing Association for Clinical Simulation and Learning; and updates to the rules regarding board evaluation of a program and the action the board can take following a program evaluation.

Nurse Specialty Certification: the portfolio option for the clinical nurse specialist will be omitted as this option to obtain licensure has sunset.

Continuing Education: requiring renewal applicants, who also apply for a controlled substance license, to complete a one-time training in opioids and other controlled substance awareness. Petitions for a waiver of continuing education must be submitted at least 30 days before the last regularly scheduled board meeting before the license expires.

Nurse Scholarship: Removal of the restriction prohibiting a student who has a full scholarship from another source from participation.

Under the current MiPLUS platform, all initial nurse licenses have a full license cycle, so the continuing education exemption is no longer needed. However, as a compromise, the board proposed that credit be granted toward the continuing education requirement for participation in learning experiences that may include clinical experiences, clinical laboratory hours, or classroom instruction related to nursing orientation or nurse residency programs.
