General purposes of the proposed amendments include: to add, clarify, and update definitions and terminology; to clarify and add flexibility to certification requirements, including requirements relevant to individuals holding out-of-state credentials; to incorporate the concept of appropriate placement; to align the rules with the new certification structure and to incorporate current career and technical education certificates into the general certification structure; to provide flexibility and benefits for members of the military and their dependents; to update permit requirements; and to provide procedures for the denial, rescission, reinstatement, and removal of suspension of teaching certificates.
