SUBSTITUTE FOR

HOUSE BILL NO. 4124

A bill to amend 1976 PA 399, entitled

"Safe drinking water act,"

by amending section 2 (MCL 325.1002), as amended by 1998 PA 56, and by adding section 7a.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Bottled drinking water" means water that is ultimately
- 3 sold, provided, or offered for human consumption in a closed
- 4 container.
- 5 (b) "Capacity assessment" means an evaluation of the
- 6 technical, financial, and managerial capability of a community
- 7 supply or nontransient noncommunity water supply to comply and
- 8 maintain compliance with all requirements of this act and the rules
- 9 promulgated under this act.

- 1 (C) "CHILD CARE CENTER" MEANS THAT TERM AS DEFINED IN SECTION
- 2 1 OF 1973 PA 116, MCL 722.111.
- 3 (D) (c) "Community supply" means a public water supply that
- 4 provides year-round service to not NO fewer than 15 living units or
- 5 which THAT regularly provides year-round service to not NO fewer
- 6 than 25 residents.
- 7 (E) (d) "Contaminant" means a physical, chemical, biological,
- 8 or radiological substance or matter in water.
- 9 (F) (e)—"Customer service connection" means the pipe between a
- 10 water main and customer site piping or building plumbing system.
- (G) (f) "Customer site piping" means an underground piping
- 12 system owned or controlled by the customer that conveys water from
- 13 the customer service connection to building plumbing systems and
- 14 other points of use on lands owned or controlled by the customer.
- 15 Customer site piping does not include any system that incorporates
- 16 treatment to protect public health.
- 17 (H) (g) "Department" means the department of environmental
- 18 quality or its authorized agent or representative.
- 19 (I) (h)—"Director" means the director of the department of
- 20 environmental quality or his or her authorized agent or
- 21 representative.
- 22 (J) (i) "Imminent hazard" means A CONDITION that, in the
- 23 judgment of the director, there is a violation, or a condition that
- 24 IS OR may cause a violation —of the state drinking water standards
- 25 at a public water supply requiring immediate action to prevent
- 26 endangering the PUBLIC health. of people.
- 27 (K) (j) "Living unit" means a house, apartment, or other

- 1 domicile occupied or intended to be occupied on a day to day basis
- 2 by an individual, family group, or equivalent.
- 3 (1) (k) "Noncommunity supply" means a public water supply that
- 4 is not a community supply, but that has not less NO FEWER than 15
- 5 service connections or that serves not fewer than 25 individuals on
- 6 an average daily basis for not less than 60 days per year.
- 7 (M) $\frac{(l)}{(l)}$ "Nontransient noncommunity water supply" means a
- 8 noncommunity public water supply that serves not NO fewer than 25
- 9 of the same individuals on an average daily basis over 6 months per
- 10 year. This definition NONTRANSIENT NONCOMMUNITY WATER SUPPLY
- 11 includes water supplies in places of employment, schools, and day-
- 12 care CHILD CARE centers.
- 13 (N) (m) "Person" means an individual, partnership,
- 14 copartnership, cooperative, firm, company, public or private
- 15 association or corporation, political subdivision, agency of the
- 16 THIS state, agency of the federal government, trust, estate, joint
- 17 structure company, or any other legal entity, or their THE legal
- 18 representative, agent, or assigns—ASSIGN OF A LEGAL ENTITY.
- 19 (O) (n)—"Plans and specifications" means drawings, data, and a
- 20 true description or representation of an entire waterworks system
- 21 or parts of the system as it exists or is to be constructed, and a
- 22 statement on how a—THE waterworks system is to be operated.
- (P) (o) "Political subdivision" means a city, village,
- 24 township, charter township, county, district, authority, or portion
- 25 or combination thereof. OF THOSE ENTITIES.
- 26 (Q) (p)—"Public water supply" means a waterworks system that
- 27 provides water for drinking or household purposes to persons other

- 1 than the supplier of the water, and does not include either of the
- 2 following:
- 3 (i) A waterworks system that supplies water to only 1 living
- 4 unit.
- $\mathbf{5}$ (ii) A waterworks system that consists solely of customer site
- 6 piping.
- 7 (q) "State drinking water standards" means quality standards
- 8 setting limits for contaminant levels or establishing treatment
- 9 techniques to meet standards necessary to protect the public
- 10 health.
- 11 (R) "SCHOOL" MEANS A PUBLIC SCHOOL OR A NONPUBLIC SCHOOL AS
- 12 THOSE TERMS ARE DEFINED IN SECTION 5 OF THE REVISED SCHOOL CODE,
- 13 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.5.
- 14 (S) (r) "Service connection" means a direct connection from a
- 15 distribution water main to a living unit or other site to provide
- 16 water for drinking or household purposes.
- 17 (T) (s)—"Source water assessment" means a state program to
- 18 delineate the boundaries of areas in the state from which 1 or more
- 19 public water supplies receive supplies of drinking water; —to
- 20 identify contaminants regulated under this act for which monitoring
- 21 is required because the state has determined they may present a
- 22 threat to public health; —and, to the extent practical, to
- 23 determine the susceptibility of the public water supply in the
- 24 delineated area to these contaminants.
- 25 (U) "STATE DRINKING WATER STANDARDS" MEANS QUALITY STANDARDS
- 26 SETTING LIMITS FOR CONTAMINANT LEVELS OR ESTABLISHING TREATMENT
- 27 TECHNIQUES TO MEET STANDARDS NECESSARY TO PROTECT THE PUBLIC

- 1 HEALTH.
- 2 (V) (t) "Supplier of water" or "supplier" means a person who
- 3 owns or operates a public water supply, and includes a water
- 4 hauler.
- 5 (W) (u) "Transient noncommunity water supply" means a
- 6 noncommunity supply that does not meet the definition of
- 7 nontransient noncommunity water supply.
- 8 (X) (v) "Water hauler" means a person engaged in bulk
- 9 vehicular transportation of water to other than the water hauler's
- 10 own household which AND THAT is intended for use or used for
- 11 drinking or household purposes. Excluded from this definition are
- 12 those WATER HAULER DOES NOT INCLUDE persons providing water solely
- 13 for employee use.
- 14 (Y) (w) "Water main" means a pipe owned or controlled by a
- 15 supplier that may convey water to a customer service connection or
- 16 to a fire hydrant.
- 17 (Z) (x) "Waterworks system" or "system" means a system of
- 18 pipes and structures through which water is obtained and
- 19 distributed, including but not limited to wells and well
- 20 structures, intakes and cribs, pumping stations, treatment plants,
- 21 storage tanks, AND pipelines and appurtenances, or a combination
- 22 thereof, OF THESE COMPONENTS, actually used or intended for use for
- 23 the purpose of furnishing water for drinking or household purposes.
- 24 (AA) (y) "Year-round service" means the ability of a supplier
- 25 of water to provide drinking water on a continuous basis to a
- 26 living unit or facility.
- 27 SEC. 7A. (1) IN ADDITION TO THE SAMPLING AND ANALYSIS REQUIRED

- 1 UNDER SECTION 7, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REQUIRE CERTAIN VULNERABLE
- 2 POPULATION FACILITIES TO CONDUCT SAMPLING, ANALYSIS, AND
- 3 REMEDIATION OF LEAD CONTAMINATION IN DRINKING WATER FROM DRINKING
- 4 WATER TAPS AND OTHER SOURCES OF DRINKING WATER USED FOR HUMAN
- 5 CONSUMPTION. THE SAMPLING AND ANALYSIS REQUIRED UNDER THIS SECTION
- 6 MUST BE CONDUCTED WITHIN 1 YEAR AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE
- 7 AMENDATORY ACT THAT ADDED THIS SECTION AND AT LEAST ONCE EVERY 3
- 8 YEARS THEREAFTER.
- 9 (2) LEAD SAMPLING AND ANALYSIS UNDER THIS SECTION AT ADULT
- 10 FOSTER CARE FACILITIES, CHILD CARE CENTERS, HOSPITALS, NURSING
- 11 HOMES, AND SCHOOLS MUST COMPLY WITH ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 12 (A) SAMPLING MUST BE CONDUCTED AT ALL BUILDINGS WHERE
- 13 CHILDREN, STUDENTS, OR RESIDENTS ARE PRESENT.
- 14 (B) FOR SCHOOLS, SAMPLING MUST BE CONDUCTED DURING THE SCHOOL
- 15 YEAR TO REPRESENT TYPICAL USE, AS PRESCRIBED BY THE DEPARTMENT.
- 16 (C) SAMPLING MUST BE DONE AT ALL DRINKING WATER TAPS AND ANY
- 17 OTHER DRINKING WATER SOURCE FOR HUMAN CONSUMPTION.
- 18 (D) TESTING PROTOCOLS MUST INCLUDE A FIRST-DRAW SAMPLE THAT IS
- 19 TAKEN AFTER AT LEAST 6 HOURS OF STAGNATION IN A 250 ML BOTTLE.
- 20 (3) LEAD SAMPLING AT COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES UNDER THIS
- 21 SECTION MUST BE CONDUCTED AT DRINKING WATER TAPS AND OTHER DRINKING
- 22 WATER SOURCES THAT ARE REPRESENTATIVE OF WATER USAGE ON CAMPUS IN A
- 23 MANNER PRESCRIBED BY THE DEPARTMENT.
- 24 (4) THE ANALYSIS OF SAMPLES COLLECTED UNDER THIS SECTION MUST
- 25 BE CONDUCTED BY A CERTIFIED LABORATORY DESCRIBED IN SECTION 7.
- 26 (5) EACH VULNERABLE POPULATION FACILITY THAT CONDUCTS SAMPLING
- 27 AND ANALYSIS OF DRINKING WATER SAMPLES UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL

- 1 MAKE THE RESULTS OF THE ANALYSIS AVAILABLE IN THE ADMINISTRATIVE
- 2 OFFICE OF THE VULNERABLE POPULATION FACILITY AND SHALL REPORT THE
- 3 RESULTS OF THE ANALYSIS TO THE DEPARTMENT. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL
- 4 MAKE THE INFORMATION RECEIVED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION AVAILABLE ON
- 5 THE DEPARTMENT'S WEBSITE.
- 6 (6) IF THE SAMPLING AND ANALYSIS OF ANY DRINKING WATER TAP OR
- 7 OTHER SOURCE OF DRINKING WATER UNDER THIS SECTION SHOWS EVIDENCE OF
- 8 LEAD IN DRINKING WATER AT A LEVEL HIGHER THAN 12 MG/L, THE OWNER OR
- 9 OPERATOR OF THE VULNERABLE POPULATION FACILITY SHALL DO ALL OF THE
- 10 FOLLOWING:
- 11 (A) IMMEDIATELY TAKE THE DRINKING WATER TAP OR SOURCE OF
- 12 DRINKING WATER OUT OF SERVICE.
- 13 (B) PROVIDE DIRECT NOTIFICATION TO THE DEPARTMENT, STAFF AT
- 14 THE VULNERABLE POPULATION FACILITY, PARENTS AND GUARDIANS, AND
- 15 OTHER USERS OF THE VULNERABLE POPULATION FACILITY IN A MANNER
- 16 APPROVED BY THE DEPARTMENT.
- 17 (C) FOR SCHOOLS, REQUIRE THE RESULTS OF THE ANALYSIS AND A
- 18 NOTICE THAT THE RESULTS EXCEED THE REPORTABLE LEAD LEVEL ON THE
- 19 SCHOOL'S WEBSITE.
- 20 (7) THE SAMPLING AND ANALYSIS REQUIRED UNDER THIS SECTION DOES
- 21 NOT APPLY TO EITHER OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 22 (A) ANY BUILDING THAT IS CONSTRUCTED AFTER JANUARY 4, 2014,
- 23 THAT IS CERTIFIED AS LEAD FREE.
- 24 (B) ANY BUILDING THAT IS DETERMINED BY A LICENSED PLUMBER OR A
- 25 LICENSED PROFESSIONAL ENGINEER TO BE LEAD FREE AND WHICH IS
- 26 DOCUMENTED IN A SIGNED STATEMENT BY THE PERSON MAKING THE
- 27 DETERMINATION.

- (8) THE SAMPLING AND ANALYSIS THAT IS CONDUCTED UNDER THIS 1
- 2 SECTION SHALL NOT BE USED FOR PURPOSES OF DETERMINING COMPLIANCE
- 3 WITH RULES PROMULGATED UNDER THIS ACT CONTAINING REQUIREMENTS FOR
- 4 SAMPLING, ANALYSIS, AND REMEDIATION DUE TO THE PRESENCE OF LEAD AND
- 5 COPPER.
- 6 (9) AS USED IN THIS SECTION:
- 7 (A) "ADULT FOSTER CARE FACILITY" MEANS THAT TERM AS DEFINED IN
- 8 SECTION 3 OF THE ADULT FOSTER CARE FACILITY LICENSING ACT, 1979 PA
- 9 218, MCL 400.703.
- (B) "COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY" MEANS ALL OF THE FOLLOWING: 10
- 11 (i) A COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY DESCRIBED IN SECTION 4, 5, OR 6 OF
- 12 ARTICLE VIII OF THE STATE CONSTITUTION OF 1963.
- 13 (ii) A JUNIOR COLLEGE OR COMMUNITY COLLEGE ESTABLISHED
- PURSUANT TO SECTION 7 OF ARTICLE VIII OF THE STATE CONSTITUTION OF 14
- 1963. 15
- (iii) AN INDEPENDENT NONPROFIT DEGREE-GRANTING COLLEGE OR 16
- 17 UNIVERSITY.
- (C) "HOSPITAL" MEANS THAT TERM AS DEFINED IN SECTION 20106 OF 18
- 19 THE PUBLIC HEALTH CODE, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.20106.
- 20 (D) "NURSING HOME" MEANS THAT TERM AS DEFINED IN SECTION 20109
- OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH CODE, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.20109. 21
- 22 (E) "VULNERABLE POPULATION FACILITY" MEANS AN ADULT FOSTER
- 23 CARE FACILITY, CHILD CARE CENTER, COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY, HOSPITAL,
- 24 NURSING HOME, OR SCHOOL.
- 25 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 26 after the date it is enacted into law.
