SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 5543

A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled "Michigan election law,"

by amending section 759 (MCL 168.759), as amended by 2018 PA 603.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 759. (1) Subject to section 761(3), at any time during the 75 days before a primary or **a** special primary, but not later than 8 p.m. on the day of a primary or **a** special primary, an elector may apply for an absent voter ballot. The elector shall apply in person or by mail with the clerk of the township or city in which the elector is registered. The clerk of a city or township shall not send by first-class mail an absent voter ballot to an elector after 5 p.m. on the Friday immediately before the election primary or special primary. In addition, the clerk of a city or

township shall not issue an absent voter ballot to a registered elector in that city or township after 4 p.m. on the day before the election primary or special primary. An application received before a primary or special primary may be for either that primary or special primary only, or for that primary or special primary and the election or special election that immediately follows. In addition, an application may be used for all elections held during a calendar year. If the secretary of state provides an absent voter ballot application that contains more election options than an absent voter ballot application provided by a city or township, and the absent voter ballot application otherwise complies with the requirements of this section, the clerk of the city or township shall honor the election options requested by an elector who uses the absent voter ballot application provided by the secretary of state. An individual may submit a voter registration application and an absent voter ballot application at the same time if applying in person with the clerk or deputy clerk of the city or township in which the individual resides. Immediately after his or her voter registration application and absent voter ballot application are approved by the clerk or deputy clerk, the individual may, subject to the identification requirement in section 761(6), complete an absent voter ballot at the clerk's office.

(2) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (1) and subject to section 761(3), at any time during the 75 days before an election or special election, but not later than 8 p.m. on the day of an election or special election, an elector may apply for an absent voter ballot. The elector shall apply in person or by mail with the clerk of the township —or city —or village—in which the voter is registered. The clerk of a city or township shall not send

by first-class mail an absent voter ballot to an elector after 5 p.m. on the Friday immediately before the election or special election. In addition, the clerk of a city or township shall not issue an absent voter ballot to a registered elector in that city or township after 4 p.m. on the day before the election or special election. An individual may submit a voter registration application and an absent voter ballot application at the same time if applying in person with the clerk or deputy clerk of the city or township in which the individual resides. Immediately after his or her voter 9 10 registration application and absent voter ballot application are 11 approved by the clerk, the individual may, subject to the 12 identification requirement in section 761(6), complete an absent voter ballot at the clerk's office. 13

- (3) An application for an absent voter ballot under this section may be made in any of the following ways:
 - (a) By a written request signed by the voter.
- (b) On an absent voter ballot application form provided for that purpose by the clerk of the city or township.
- (c) On an absent voter ballot application form provided for that purpose by the secretary of state.
 - (d) (c) On a federal postcard application.
- (4) An applicant for an absent voter ballot shall sign the application. A clerk or assistant clerk shall not deliver an absent voter ballot to an applicant who does not sign the application. A person shall not be in possession of a signed absent voter ballot application except for the applicant; a member of the applicant's immediate family; a person residing in the applicant's household; a person whose job normally includes the handling of mail, but only during the course of his or her employment; a registered elector

2	assistant of the clerk, or other authorized election official. A

22	(6) The following instructions for an applicant for an absent
23	voter ballot must be included with each application furnished an
24	applicant:

26	INSTRUCTIONS FOR APPLICANTS FOR ABSENT VOTER BALLOTS
27	
28	Step 1. After completely filling out the application, sign and
29	date the application in the place designated. Your signature must



appear on the application or you will not receive an absent voter ballot.

Step 2. Deliver the application by 1 of the following methods:

- (a) Place the application in an envelope addressed to the appropriate clerk and place the necessary postage upon the return envelope and deposit it in the United States mail or with another public postal service, express mail service, parcel post service, or common carrier.
- (b) Deliver the application personally to the clerk's office, to the clerk, or to an authorized assistant of the clerk.
- (c) In either (a) or (b), a member of the immediate family of the voter including a father-in-law, mother-in-law, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, grandparent, or grandchild or a person residing in the voter's household may mail or deliver the application to the clerk for the applicant.
- (d) If an applicant cannot return the application in any of the above methods, the applicant may select any registered elector to return the application. The person returning the application must sign and return the certificate at the bottom of the application.
- (7) A person who prints and distributes absent voter ballot applications shall print on the application the warning, certificate of authorized registered elector returning absent voter ballot application, and instructions required by this section.
- (8) A person who makes a false statement in an absent voter ballot application is guilty of a misdemeanor. A person who forges a signature on an absent voter ballot application is guilty of a felony. A person who is not authorized in this act and who both distributes absent voter ballot applications to absent voters and

- 1 returns those absent voter ballot applications to a clerk or
- 2 assistant of the clerk is guilty of a misdemeanor.
