SENATE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 4277

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending section 602b (MCL 257.602b), as amended by 2016 PA 332.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 602b. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, a person—an individual shall not read, manually type, or send a text message on a wireless 2-way communication—use a mobile electronic device that is located in the person's hand or in the person's lap, including a wireless telephone used in cellular telephone service or personal communication service, while operating a motor vehicle or a school bus. that is moving on a highway or street in this state. As used in this subsection, a wireless 2-way communication device does not include a global positioning or navigation system



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- 1 that is affixed to the motor vehicle. This subsection does not
- 2 apply to a person operating a commercial vehicle. This subsection
- 3 does not apply beginning 5 years after the effective date of the
- 4 amendatory act that added subsection (2).
- 5 (2) Subsection (1) does not apply to any of the following 6 situations:
- 7 (a) A law enforcement officer, firefighter, emergency medical
- 8 technician, paramedic, operator of an authorized emergency vehicle,
- 9 or similarly engaged paid or volunteer public safety first
- 10 responder during the performance of that individual's official
- 11 duties, or a public utility employee or contractor acting within
- 12 the scope of that individual's employment when responding to a
- 13 public utility emergency.
- 14 (b) The use of a mobile electronic device for emergency
- 15 purposes, including a text messaging device to contact a 9-1-1
- 16 system, or an emergency call to a law enforcement agency, health
- 17 care provider, fire department, or other emergency services agency
- 18 or entity to report to appropriate authorities a fire, traffic
- 19 accident, serious road hazard, or medical or hazardous materials
- 20 emergency; to report the operator of another motor vehicle who is
- 21 driving in a reckless or otherwise unsafe manner or who appears to
- 22 be driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs; or to report a
- 23 crime.
- 24 (c) The use of a global positioning or navigation system
- 25 feature of a mobile electronic device if information is not entered
- 26 by hand into the global positioning or navigation system feature of
- 27 the mobile electronic device.
- 28 (d) The use of a mobile electronic device in a voice-operated
- 29 or hands-free mode if the operator of the motor vehicle does not

- use his or her hands to operate the device, except for either of
 the following:
- 3 (i) Using a single button, tap, or swipe to activate or
 4 deactivate a feature or function of the mobile electronic device or
 5 to select a telephone number or name.
- 6 (ii) Using a mobile electronic device that is integrated into a
 7 motor vehicle and utilizes the user interfaces that are permanently
 8 installed into the motor vehicle.
- 9 (3) An individual shall not operate a motor vehicle or school
 10 bus while accessing, reading, or posting to a social networking
 11 site.
 - (4) An individual shall not operate a motor vehicle or school bus while viewing, recording, or transmitting a video on a mobile electronic device. This subsection does not apply to a mobile electronic device used for the sole purpose of continuously recording or broadcasting video inside or outside of a motor vehicle or school bus.
- 18 (5) $\frac{(2)}{(2)}$ Except as otherwise provided in this section, a person 19 an individual shall not read, manually type, or send a text message 20 on a wireless 2-way communication device that is located in the person's individual's hand or in the person's individual's lap, 21 including a wireless telephone used in cellular telephone service 22 23 or personal communication service, while operating a commercial 24 motor vehicle or a school bus on a highway or street in this state. 25 As used in this subsection, a wireless 2-way 26 communication device" means a mobile telephone as that term is defined in 49 CFR 390.5. Wireless 2-way communication device does 27

not include a global positioning or navigation system that is

affixed to the commercial motor vehicle. or school bus.

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- 1 (6) (3) Except as otherwise provided in this section, a person
- 2 an individual shall not use a hand-held mobile telephone to conduct
- ${f 3}$ a voice communication while operating a commercial motor vehicle $\frac{{f or}}{{f or}}$
- 4 a school bus on a highway, including while temporarily stationary
- 5 due to traffic, a traffic control device, or other momentary
- 6 delays. This subsection does not apply if the operator of the
- 7 commercial vehicle or school bus has moved the vehicle to the side
- 8 of, or off, a highway and has stopped in a location where the
- 9 vehicle can safely remain stationary. As used in this subsection,
- 10 "mobile telephone" means that term as defined in 49 CFR 390.5.
- 11 Mobile telephone does not include a 2-way radio service or citizens
- 12 band radio service. As used in this subsection, "use a hand-held
- 13 mobile telephone" means 1 or more of the following:
- 14 (a) Using at least 1 hand to hold a mobile telephone to
- 15 conduct a voice communication.
- 16 (b) Dialing or answering a mobile telephone by pressing more
- 17 than a single button.
- 18 (c) Reaching for a mobile telephone in a manner that requires
- 19 a driver to maneuver so that he or she is no longer in a seated
- 20 driving position, restrained by a seat belt that is installed as
- 21 required by 49 CFR 393.93 and adjusted in accordance with the
- vehicle manufacturer's instructions.
- 23 (7) $\frac{(4)}{(4)}$ Subsections $\frac{(1)}{(2)}$, (5) and $\frac{(3)}{(6)}$ do not apply to
- 24 an individual who is using a device described in subsection $\frac{(1)}{(5)}$
- 25 or $\frac{(3)}{(6)}$ to do any of the following:
- 26 (a) Report a traffic accident, medical emergency, or serious
- 27 road hazard.
- 28 (b) Report a situation in which the person individual believes
- 29 his or her personal safety is in jeopardy.

- (c) Report or avert the perpetration or potential perpetration
 of a criminal act against the individual or another
 person.individual.
- 4 (d) Carry out official duties as a police officer, law
 5 enforcement official, member of a paid or volunteer fire
 6 department, or operator of an emergency vehicle.
 - (e) Operate or program the operation of an automated motor vehicle while testing or operating the automated motor vehicle without a human operator while the automated driving system is engaged.
 - (5) Subsection (1) does not apply to a person using an ondemand automated motor vehicle network.
- 13 (8) (6) An Except as provided in subsection (9), an individual
 14 who violates this section is responsible for a civil infraction and
 15 shall must be ordered to pay a civil fine as follows:do the
 16 following:
- 17 (a) For a first violation, pay a \$100.00 civil fine or perform 18 16 hours of community service, or both.
- (b) For a second or subsequent violation, \$200.00.pay a
 \$250.00 civil fine or perform 24 hours of community service, or
 both.
 - (9) If an individual is involved in an accident at the time the individual violates this section, the civil fine ordered must be double the amount under subsection (8) and a law enforcement officer investigating the accident shall indicate in a written accident report that the individual was using a mobile electronic device at the time of the accident.
- (10) (7) This section supersedes all local ordinances
 regulating the use of a communications mobile electronic device

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- 1 while operating a motor vehicle in motion on a highway or street,
- 2 except that a unit of local government may adopt an ordinance or
- 3 enforce an existing ordinance substantially corresponding to this
- 4 section.
- 5 (11) A court may suspend an individual's driver license for
- 6 not more than 90 days if the individual is responsible for 3 or
- 7 more civil infractions under this section within a 3-year period.
- 8 (12) A law enforcement officer enforcing this section may
- 9 treat a violation of this section as the primary or sole reason for
- 10 issuing a citation to a driver. A law enforcement officer shall not
- 11 search a motor vehicle or the driver or passenger in the motor
- 12 vehicle solely because of a violation of this section.
- 13 (13) This section does not apply to either of the following:
- 14 (a) A level 3, 4, or 5 automated driving system, as described
- 15 in "J3016: Taxonomy and Definitions for Terms Related to Driving
- 16 Automation Systems for On-Road Motor Vehicles", April 2021 edition,
- 17 published by SAE International, or an automated vehicle equipped
- 18 with an automated driving system as described in this subdivision
- 19 during testing or operation with the automated driving system
- 20 engaged.
- 21 (b) Viewing or using in a hands-free manner a device mounted
- 22 in a vehicle for displaying information related to testing or
- 23 operating an automated driving system or automated technology.
- 24 (14) Except as otherwise provided in this section, as used in
- 25 this section:
- 26 (a) "Mobile electronic device" means any handheld or portable
- 27 electronic device capable of providing wireless data or voice
- 28 communication between 2 or more individuals or amusement, including
- 29 a cellular telephone; broadband personal communication device; 2-

- 1 way messaging device; text messaging device; pager; electronic
- 2 device that can receive or transmit text or character-based images,
- 3 access or store data, or connect to the internet; personal digital
- 4 assistant; laptop computer; computer tablet; stand-alone computer;
- 5 portable computing device; mobile device with a touchscreen display
- 6 that is designed to be worn; electronic game; equipment that is
- 7 capable of playing a video, taking photographs, capturing images,
- 8 or recording or transmitting video; and any similar device that is
- 9 readily removable from a vehicle and is used to write, send, or
- 10 read text or data or capture images or video through manual input.
- 11 Mobile electronic device does not include a radio designed for the
- 12 Citizens Band Service or the Amateur Radio Service of the Federal
- 13 Communications Commission or a commercial 2-way radio
- 14 communications device or equipment permanently installed in a motor
- 15 vehicle. Mobile electronic device does not include a medical device
- 16 that is designed to be worn, including, but not limited to, an
- 17 insulin pump.
- 18 (b) "Operate" means to drive or assume physical control of a
- 19 motor vehicle on a public way, street, road, or highway, including
- 20 operation while temporarily stationary because of traffic, road
- 21 conditions, a traffic light, or a stop sign. Operate does not
- 22 include a motor vehicle that is lawfully parked.
- (c) "Social networking site" means any web-based service that
- 24 allows individuals to construct a profile within a founded system
- 25 and communicate with other users of the site for social or
- 26 amusement purposes.
- 27 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 180 days
- 28 after the date it is enacted into law.
- 29 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
