SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 5623

A bill to amend 1998 PA 58, entitled "Michigan liquor control code of 1998,"

by amending section 513 (MCL 436.1513), as amended by 2021 PA 116.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 513. (1) The commission may issue to the governing board
- 2 of a college or university, without regard to the quota provisions
- 3 of section 531, a license to sell alcoholic liquor for consumption
- 4 on the premises of a conference center operated by the governing
- 5 board. Licenses granted under this subsection may be used only for
- 6 the sale of alcoholic liquor at regularly scheduled conference
- 7 center activities. The sale of alcoholic liquor to unscheduled
- 8 patrons or at unscheduled events is prohibited under this
- 9 subsection.





- 1 (2) Subject to section 531, the commission may issue a license
- 2 to a private entity for the sale of alcoholic liquor for
- 3 consumption on the premises of a hotel located on land owned by
- 4 Central Michigan University if both of the following circumstances
- 5 exist:
- 6 (a) The land is leased or subleased at fair market value to a
- 7 private entity that owns, leases, or subleases the hotel building
- 8 and its fixtures.
- 9 (b) The hotel and land are located within an industrial,
- 10 research, or commercial development park established by the

- 12 (3) Subject to section 531, the commission may issue a license
- 13 to a private entity for the sale of alcoholic liquor for
- 14 consumption on the licensed premises of a restaurant located on
- 15 land owned by Wayne State University if both of the following
- 16 circumstances exist:
- 17 (a) The land is leased or subleased at fair market value to a
- 18 private entity that owns, leases, or subleases the licensed
- 19 premises for the operation of a restaurant.
- 20 (b) The restaurant is located within an area designated for
- 21 industrial, research, or commercial development by the governing
- 22 board of Wayne State University.
- 23 (4) Subject to section 531, the commission may issue a license
- 24 to a private entity for the sale of alcoholic liquor for
- 25 consumption on the licensed premises of a restaurant located on
- 26 land owned by Western Michigan University if both of the following
- 27 circumstances exist:
- 28 (a) The land is leased or subleased at fair market value to a
- 29 private entity that owns, leases, or subleases the licensed

- 1 premises for the operation of a restaurant.
- (b) The restaurant is located within an area designated
 industrial, research, or commercial development by the governing
 board of Western Michigan University.
- 5 (5) Subject to section 531, the commission may issue to the 6 governing board of Northern Michigan University a license for the 7 sale of alcoholic liquor for consumption on the licensed premises 8 of a restaurant located on land owned and operated by Northern 9 Michigan University if both of the following apply:
- 10 (a) The license was originally acquired on the open market at 11 fair market value.
- (b) The restaurant is located within an area designated for
 community development or conference activities by the governing
 board of Northern Michigan University.
- 15 (6) Subject to section 531, the commission may issue a license 16 to a golf course clubhouse and any adjacent outdoor service area 17 owned or operated by a college or university for the sale of 18 alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises of the golf course 19 clubhouse and any adjacent outdoor service area.
 - (7) Subject to section 531, the commission may issue a license to a private entity for the sale of alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises of a baseball stadium located on land owned by Eastern Michigan University if the baseball stadium and adjacent outdoor service area is leased or subleased at fair market value during the summer period between the end of the university's spring term and the beginning of its fall term.
- (8) Subject to section 531, the commission may issue a license
 to a private entity for the sale of alcoholic liquor for
 consumption on the premises of a baseball stadium located on land

- 19 (a) "College" or "university" means a 2-year or 4-year state
- 20 supported institution of higher education.
- 21 (b) "Conference center" means a either of the following:
- 22 (i) A building or portion of a building, other than a student
- 23 residence hall or student center, that has meeting rooms, banquet
- 24 areas, social halls, overnight accommodations, and related
- 25 facilities for special activities scheduled by the college or
- 26 university, and that, in the judgment of the commission, has been
- 27 regularly used for conferences and lodging of guests. All of the
- 28 following are considered conference centers for the purpose of this
