SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 995

A bill to amend 1979 PA 94, entitled "The state school aid act of 1979,"

by amending section 27c (MCL 388.1627c), as amended by 2024 PA 120.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 27c. (1) From the state school aid fund money

2 appropriated in section 11, there is allocated \$30,000,000.00 for

2024-2025 and from the educator fellowship public provider fund

4 money appropriated in section 11, there is allocated \$20,000,000.00

5 for 2024-2025 for the MI future educator student teacher stipend

6 program. Except as otherwise provided in this section, the funds

7 allocated under this section must be paid to eligible educator

8 preparation programs for payments to eligible student teachers

9 working in a district or a qualifying publicly funded preschool





- program in this state. At the close of the fiscal year, state
 school aid fund money allocated under this section that is unspent
 must be deposited into the educator fellowship public provider fund
 in section 27d.
 - (2) An eligible student teacher under this subsection must meet all of the following:
- 7 (a) The individual must be admitted to an eligible educator 8 preparation program, be working toward a teacher certification, be 9 participating in required student teaching coursework, and be 10 maintaining satisfactory academic progress. As used in this 11 subdivision, "required student teaching coursework" means credit hours, or the program equivalent, required by an eligible educator 12 preparation program for successful completion of the program. This 13 14 coursework must include regular placement in a district or a 15 qualifying publicly funded preschool program in this state where the student gains real-world, first-hand experience working in a 16 classroom, teaching students, engaging in the day-to-day activities 17 18 of a certified teacher, and working daily under the guidance of a certified teacher. 19
- 20 (b) The individual must timely complete an application in a 21 form and manner prescribed by the department of lifelong education, 22 advancement, and potential. The application must include the 23 district or the qualifying publicly funded preschool program in 24 this state in which the individual is working as a student teacher 25 and must include a certification by the district or the qualifying 26 publicly funded preschool program in this state and the 27 individual's eligible educator preparation program that the student is working as a student teacher. If the individual's eligible 28 29 educator preparation program is not provided by a public

- 7 (c) The individual must not have received a payment from funds
 8 under this subsection previously, unless the individual is enrolled
 9 in an eligible educator preparation program that requires multiple
 10 semesters of student teaching.
 - (d) If an individual is employed by their district **or qualifying publicly funded preschool program in this state** as a teacher of record, they are not eligible for payment under this section.
- (e) An individual that is a current City Year corps memberenrolled in an eligible educator preparation program is eligiblefor payment under this section.
 - (3) The department of lifelong education, advancement, and potential shall pay each eligible educator preparation program provided by a public institution of higher education an amount not to exceed \$9,600.00 per academic semester for each eligible student teacher working in a district or a qualifying publicly funded preschool program in this state.
 - (4) If the an individual's eligible educator preparation program is not provided by a public institution of higher education, the department of lifelong education, advancement, and potential shall pay an amount not to exceed \$9,600.00 per academic semester for each eligible student teacher who is placed in a district or a qualifying publicly funded preschool program in this

state to the 1 of the following:

- (a) The district in which the individual is working placed as 2 a student teacher. , and that district 3
- (b) The intermediate district or consortium of intermediate 5 districts that provides funding under section 32d to the qualifying publicly funded preschool program in which the individual is placed 7 as a student teacher.
- 8 (c) An intermediate district or consortium of intermediate 9 districts.
- 10 (5) The recipient of funds under subsection (4) must forward 11 the amount received to the individual's eligible educator 12 preparation program.
- (6) If funding allocated under this section is insufficient to 13 14 fully fund all eligible student teachers, the department of 15 lifelong education, advancement, and potential shall first award funding for eligible student teachers who are also Pell grant 16 recipients and then shall distribute funding in the order in which 17 18 applications were received. It is intended that payments under this subsection subsections (3) and (4) are made at the beginning of the 19 20 semester in 1 lump sum for eligible student teachers.
- 21 (7) (4) Eligible educator preparation programs shall pay funds 22 received under this section, in entirety, to the eligible student 23 teacher.
- 24 (8) (5) Notwithstanding section 17b, the department of 25 lifelong education, advancement, and potential shall make payments under this section on a schedule determined by the department of 26 27 lifelong education, advancement, and potential.
- 28 (9) (6) If the amount allocated in subsection (1) is 29 insufficient to fully fund awards under this section, there is

- 1 appropriated from the educator fellowship public provider fund in
- 2 section 27d the amount necessary to fully fund the programs
- 3 described in this section. The state budget director shall notify
- 4 the house and senate appropriations subcommittees on K to 12 school
- 5 aid and the house and senate fiscal agencies of any additional
- 6 appropriation described in this subsection.
- 7 (10) (7)—As used in this section: , "eligible
- 8 (a) "Eligible educator preparation program" means an9 institution of higher education that meets all of the following:
- 10 (i) (a)—Is a public or private institution of higher education
 11 in this state.
 - (\ddot{u}) (\dot{b})—Has an established school of education with an educator preparation program approved by the department.
 - (iii) (e)—Has not been deemed as ineligible to receive Michigan achievement scholarship funding under section 248 as a result of exceeding tuition restraint requirements described in section 248.
 - (b) "Qualifying publicly funded preschool program in this state" means a program supported by public funds as determined by the department of lifelong education, advancement, and potential, including, but not limited to, programs funded by the great start readiness program under section 32d or Head Start.
