THE APPARENT PROBLEM:

Presently, people who have had their licenses revoked, suspended or restricted cannot obtain an official state identification card. Without an identification card, these people may not have any other means of officially verifying their identity.

THE CONTENT OF THE BILL:

The bill would allow the issuance of an ID card to people with revoked, suspended or restricted licenses.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS:

According to the House Fiscal Agency, the bill would have no fiscal implications to the state. (4-20-87)

ARGUMENTS:

For:

Presently, people who have had their licenses revoked, suspended or restricted cannot obtain an official identification card. Without official state identification card, they may have problems cashing checks and performing other financial procedures. The bill would enable people with restricted, suspended or revoked licenses to obtain an official state identification card, thus alleviating some of the problems that are associated with not having an identification card.
