### THE APPARENT PROBLEM:

In listing the specialty fields in dentistry, Michigan's Public Health Code refers to "pedodontics" and "oral surgery". The national and state dental specialty designations for these specialty fields, however, is "pediatric dentistry" and "oral and maxillofacial surgery". The Michigan Society of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons was joined by the Michigan Academy of Pediatric Dentistry in requesting legislation that would bring state terminology naming these specialties into conformity with that used by their state and national professional associations.

# THE CONTENT OF THE BILL:

The bill would amend the Public Health Code to change the terminology describing two dental specialties. "Pedodontics" (and "pedodontists") would be changed to "pediatric dentistry" ("pediatric dentists"), and "oral surgery" ("oral surgeon") would be changed to "oral and maxillofacial surgery" ("oral and maxillofacial surgeon").

## For:

The bill would bring the terminology describing two dental specialties that appears now in state law into conformity with the terminology used by the state and national dental specialty associations. The bill would simply institute a name change; there would be no change in scope of practice.
