A SUMMARY OF HOUSE BILL 4717 AS INTRODUCED 6-2-87

The bill would amend the Department of Corrections act to require the parole board, in considering a grant of parole for prisoners who were infected with acquired immunodeficiency syndrome (AIDS) — or other sexually communicable diseases — during imprisonment, to take into account whether the prisoner voluntarily contacted each person whom he or she may have exposed to the virus or disease. Under the bill, the appropriate institutional staff who were required to prepare parole eligibility reports would be required to include in the report whether a prisoner had tested positive for the presence of the human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) or the antibody to HIV, had been diagnosed as having AIDS or AIDS related complex, or had been diagnosed as having any other sexually transmitted disease. The above conditions would be required in addition to any other conditions or requirements of parole imposed by the act.
