SUMMARY OF HOUSE BILL 4544 as passed by the House:

The bill would amend Public Act 308 of 1929 to eliminate the notarization requirement for the reports which buyers and sellers of furs, pelts, skins, and plumage of protected game birds and game animals are required to submit at the end of the open season for those furs, pelts, skins or plumage in their possession, and also for the reports which must be submitted on or before the 10th day of each month, itemizing similar items purchased or sold during the preceding month.

The bill would also delete references to the "director of conservation", and replace them with "director of the Department of Natural Resources".
