SUMMARY OF HOUSE BILL 4653 as passed by the House:

The bill would amend Public Act 289 of 1925 to specify that fingerprinting would not be mandatory when an arrest was made for a violation of the Michigan Sportsmen Fishing Law or the Game Law if the violation in question constituted a misdemeanor.

FISCAL IMPACT
