SUMMARY OF HOUSE BILL 5512 (Substitute H-1) as passed by the House:

The bill would amend the Public Health Code, which currently requires an ambulance operation to provide service 24 hours a day and seven days a week, to:

- Exempt from the Code's service requirements an ambulance operation that: was operated by a nonprofit corporation incorporated under the Nonprofit Corporation Act, did not charge a fee for services rendered by the ambulance operation, and did not pay its personnel.
- Require exempted ambulance operations, during the time the ambulance operation was not in service, to provide for an automated telephone call forwarding system that transferred requests for emergency assistance either to a universal 911 emergency telephone number or to an ambulance operation that was in compliance with the Code's ambulance operation requirements.
