



HOUSE BILL No. 4851

May 16, 1995, Introduced by Reps. Johnson, Bobier, Middaugh, Alley, Gilmer, Jellema, Hammerstrom, Bodem, Sikkema and Oxender and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to make appropriations to the department of natural resources to provide for the acquisition of land; to provide for the development of public recreation facilities; to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state agencies and officials; and to provide for the expenditure of appropriations.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 1. There is appropriated for the department of natural
2 resources to supplement former appropriations for the fiscal year ending
3 September 30, 1995, the sum of \$19,723,300.00 for land acquisition and
4 grants and \$4,470,700.00 for public recreation facility development and
5 grants as provided in section 35 of article IX of the state constitution
6 of 1963 and the Michigan natural resources trust fund act, Act No. 101 of
7 the Public Acts of 1985, being sections 318.501 to 318.516 of the
8 Michigan Compiled Laws, from the following funds:

9 Sec. 3. The department of natural resources shall enter into agree-
10 ments with local units of government for the purpose of administering the
11 grants identified in section 1. Among other provisions, the agreements
12 shall require that grant recipients agree to dedicate to public recre-
13 ation uses in perpetuity the land acquired; to replace lands converted or
14 lost to other than public recreation use; and to convey to the state any
15 mineral interests acquired by the grant recipient with an exception
16 allowed for a share of the mineral interests acquired, which share is
17 based on the portion of the fair market value of the property that was
18 provided by the local cash contribution of the grant recipient. The
19 agreements shall also provide the full payments of grants be made only
20 after proof of acquisition is submitted by the grant recipient and all
21 costs are verified by the department of natural resources.

22 Sec. 4. The department of natural resources shall take steps neces-
23 sary to make available federal or other funds that may become available
24 for the purpose for which appropriations are made in section 1, and to
25 use any or all of the appropriations to meet matching requirements which
26 are determined to be in the best interest of the state.

1 Sec. 5. Any unobligated balance in any appropriation made under
2 section 1 shall not revert to the fund from which appropriated at the
3 close of the fiscal year, but shall continue until the purpose for which
4 it was appropriated is completed. The unexpended balance of any appro-
5 priation made in section 1 remaining after the purpose for which it was
6 appropriated is completed shall revert to the Michigan natural resources
7 trust fund and be made available for appropriation.

8 Sec. 6. If a person or organization has acquired an option on a
9 parcel of property prior to final determination by the department of nat-
10 ural resources and the Michigan natural resources trust fund board, the
11 property shall not be considered for acquisition unless the department
12 and board can demonstrate that a clear recreational advantage exists in
13 obtaining the parcel of property for the people of the state at a reason-
14 able fair market value.

15 Sec. 7. As required by section 1903(3) of the natural resources and
16 environmental protection act, Act No. 451 of the Public Acts of 1994,
17 being section 324.1903 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, the grants-in-aid
18 to local units of government shall be awarded pursuant to this act.
