A bill to amend 1979 PA 94, entitled "The state school aid act of 1979," by amending sections 11, 20, 99, and 107 (MCL 388.1611, 388.1620, 388.1699, and 388.1707), sections 11, 20, and 99 as amended and section 107 as added by 1996 PA 300, and by adding sections 104b and 105a.

(The bill was received from the Senate on May 13, with substitute (S-1), title amendment and immediate effect given by the Senate, consideration of which, under the rules, was postponed until May 14.)

The question being on concurring in the adoption of the substitute (S-1) made to the bill by the Senate,

Rep. Oxender moved to amend the substitute (S-1) as follows:

1. Amend page 2, line 20, by striking out "\$8,233,527,000.00" and inserting "\$8,233,547,000.00".
2. Amend page 3, line 4, by striking out "\$8,280,327,000.00" and inserting "\$8,280,347,000.00".
3. Amend page 5, line 19, by striking out "\$8,004,086,300.00" and inserting "\$8,004,106,300.00".
4. Amend page 9, line 7, after "1963," by inserting "EXCEPT FOR A DISTRICT THAT WAS NOTIFIED OF SUCH A MILLAGE REDUCTION IN 1996 AFTER THE LAST PERMISSIBLE DATE TO SCHEDULE AN ELECTION TO OVERRIDE THAT MILLAGE REDUCTION,".

Amend page 26, following line 23, section 104a, subsection (4), after the first "diploma." by striking out "FOR PUPILS SCHEDULED TO GRADUATE IN 1997, IF THE PUPIL'S PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN OR, IF THE PUPIL IS AT LEAST AGE 18 OR IS AN EMANCIPATED MINOR, THE PUPIL REQUESTS THE ENDORSEMENT AND IF THE BOARD OF THE DISTRICT DETERMINES THAT A PUPIL QUALIFIES FOR A STATE-ENDORSED DIPLOMA, THE BOARD SHALL INDICATE ON THE PUPIL'S HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA AND TRANSCRIPT THAT THE PUPIL ACHIEVED THE PROFICIENCY NECESSARY FOR RECEIPT OF A STATE-ENDORSED DIPLOMA. BEGINNING WITH PUPILS SCHEDULED TO GRADUATE IN 1998, IF" and inserting "If".

3. Amend page 26, following line 23, section 104a, subsection (5), after "test or assessment." by striking out "BEGINNING IN 1998,".

4. Amend page 26, following line 23, section 104a, subsection (5), after "awarded a state-endorsed diploma" by inserting "AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN THIS SECTION".

5. Amend page 34, following line 5, following section 161A, by striking out all of enacting section 1.

3. Amend page 19, line 22, after "than" by striking out "JUNE 30" and inserting "December 31".
4. Amend page 19, line 23, after "year" by inserting "OR, FOR REPORTING IN 1996-97 ONLY, ADJUSTED NOT LATER THAN JUNE 30 OF THE IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING FISCAL YEAR".
5. Amend page 20, line 12, after "year." by inserting "FOR REPORTING OCCURRING IN 1996-97, IF A DISTRICT OR PUBLIC SCHOOL ACADEMY SUBMITS AN ADJUSTMENT TO THE DEPARTMENT AFTER DECEMBER 31, 1996 IN THE NUMBER OF PUPILS USED FOR DETERMINING PAYMENTS UNDER THIS SECTION, THE DISTRICT OR PUBLIC SCHOOL ACADEMY SHALL INCLUDE WITH THE SUBMISSION AN EXPLANATION FOR THE ADJUSTMENT AND DOCUMENTATION SATISFACTORY TO THE DEPARTMENT TO JUSTIFY THE ADJUSTMENT.".

Amend page 26, following line 23, section 104a, subsection (2), after "(2)" by striking out "For pupils scheduled to graduate in 1997, if a pupil achieves the outcomes required by the state board, as measured by an assessment instrument developed under subsection (8) (7), for a state-endorsed high school diploma, or meets the requirements described in FORMER subsection (1)(c) for a state-endorsed high school diploma, in 1 or more of the subject areas of communications skills, mathematics, and science, AND IF THE PUPIL OR PUPIL'S PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN REQUESTS THE ENDORSEMENT AS PROVIDED UNDER SUBSECTION (4), the pupil's district shall award a state endorsement on the pupil's diploma in each of the subject areas in which the pupil demonstrated the required proficiency.".

2. Amend page 26, following line 23, section 104a, subsection (2), after "Beginning with pupils scheduled to graduate in" by striking out "1998" and inserting "1999".

3. Amend page 26, following line 23, section 104a, subsection (2), after "science, and" by striking out the comma and "beginning with pupils scheduled to graduate in 2000,".
