### **A SUMMARY OF HOUSE BILL 4011 AS INTRODUCED 1-8-97**

Currently, under the Code of Criminal Procedure, the term of imprisonment for someone who is convicted and sentenced to a term of imprisonment for a felony committed while he or she was on parole from a sentence for a previous offense begins to run when the remaining portion of the term of imprisonment imposed for the previous offense expires. The bill would amend this provision to specify that the parole violation term would begin to run when the maximum term of imprisonment for the previous offense expired, or one year, whichever were less.
