A SUMMARY OF HOUSE BILL 4112 AS INTRODUCED 1-28-97

House Bill 4112 would amend the juvenile code (the law establishing jurisdiction of the juvenile division of the probate court) to add a section that would allow a probate court the dispositional option of placing a juvenile who was 17 years old or older in a county jail for up to one year.

[Note: The bill's provisions are not consistent with the provisions of Public Act 244 of 1996, enrolled Senate Bill 682. If enacted, this bill would conflict with key provisions of that act and, as a result, would also interfere with many related provisions of legislative package enacted in 1996, commonly known as the juvenile justice reform package (Public Acts 244 - 250, 252 - 253, 255 - 257, and 259 - 262 of 1996.
