SUBSTITUTE FOR

HOUSE BILL NO. 4849

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending sections 14301, 14302, 14303, 14304, 14306, 14501, 14502, 14503, 14504, 14505, 14506, and 14510 (MCL 324.14301, 324.14302, 324.14303, 324.14304, 324.14306, 324.14501, 324.14502, 324.14503, 324.14504, 324.14505, 324.14506, and 324.14510) and by adding sections 14511 and 14512; and to repeal acts and parts of acts.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 14301. As used in this part:

2 (a) "Office" means the office of waste reduction created in
3 section 14302. "DEPARTMENT" MEANS THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMEN4 TAL QUALITY.

5 (b) "Waste" means hazardous waste as defined in6 section 11103; solid waste as defined in section 11506; liquid

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1 industrial waste as defined in section 12101; discharges 2 regulated by part 31; and air contaminants regulated by part 55. 3 (c) "Waste reduction" means any practice, such as an equip-4 ment or technology modification, a process or procedure modifica-5 tion, a reformulation or redesign of a product, a substitution of 6 raw materials, or improved management, training, or inventory 7 control, which practice is undertaken by a person to DIRECTLY OR 8 INDIRECTLY reduce the volume or quantity or toxicity of waste 9 that may be released into the environment or that is treated at a 10 location other than the location where it is produced.

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Sec. 14302. (1) The office of waste reduction is created within the department of natural resources to advise the department on methods of incorporating SHALL INCORPORATE waste reduction goals within the department of natural resources' ITS regulatory and permit programs, including data collection and analysis to advance the concept and implementation of waste reduction.

18 (2) The department <u>of natural resources</u> shall employ per19 sonnel and provide support staff as are necessary to implement
20 this part.

21 Sec. 14303. (1) The <u>office</u> DEPARTMENT shall do all of the 22 following:

(a) Identify opportunities to encourage waste reduction
 through the department of natural resources' DEPARTMENT'S regu latory programs.

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(b) Identify opportunities to encourage waste reduction
 through the department of natural resources' DEPARTMENT'S
 permit programs.

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4 (c) Identify how waste reduction efforts should be docu-5 mented in environmental impact statements.

6 (d) Analyze and make recommendations on the value of impos7 ing statewide goals or goals for particular wastes, or both, for
8 waste reduction, minimum recycling standards, and waste treatment
9 standards.

10 (e) Publish an annual analysis of waste reduction efforts11 and potentials in the state.

12 (2) In performing its responsibilities under subsection (1),
13 the office DEPARTMENT shall place a particular emphasis on
14 in-plant waste reduction.

(3) Consistent with the congressional declaration in section 16 1003(b) of subtitle A of title II of Public Law 89-272, 42 17 U.S.C. 6902, that it is the national policy of the United States 18 that, wherever feasible, hazardous waste is to be reduced or 19 eliminated as expeditiously as possible, the <u>office</u> DEPARTMENT 20 shall place a particular emphasis on the reduction of a waste 21 that is a hazardous waste as defined in section 11103.

Sec. 14304. (1) The office shall complete the studies provided in section 11110(3) upon the request of the department and shall provide the information generated by those studies to the department. (2) The department shall assure that relevant information received under section 313 of subtitle B of title III of the superfund amendments and reauthorization act of 1986,

House Bill No. 4849 4 1 Public Law 99-499, 42 U.S.C. 11023, is transmitted to the 2 hazardous waste policy committee by the -office DEPARTMENT. Sec. 14306. The office DEPARTMENT shall prepare and 3 4 deliver, before January 1 of each year, a report detailing the 5 efforts the -office DEPARTMENT has undertaken during the previ-6 ous fiscal year to implement this part. The annual report shall 7 be delivered to the legislature, the governor, and the chair-8 persons of the appropriations committees in the senate and the 9 house of representatives for their use in evaluating future 10 appropriations for the -office DEPARTMENT TO IMPLEMENT THIS 11 PART. The annual report may include the information generated 12 pursuant to sections 14303 and 14304 and may recommend changes in 13 policies and regulatory approaches that will encourage waste 14 reduction.

15 Sec. 14501. As used in this part:

16 (a) "Committee" means the waste reduction advisory commit-17 tee created in section 14507.

18 (A) (b) "Department" means the department of commerce
19 ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY.

20 (B) (c) "Director" means the director of <u>commerce</u> THE
 21 DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY.

(C) "RETAP" MEANS THE RETIRED ENGINEERS TECHNICAL ASSISTANCEPROGRAM CREATED IN SECTION 14511.

24 (d) "Service" means the waste reduction assistance service
25 created in section 14502. "RETAP FUND" MEANS THE FUND CREATED IN
26 SECTION 14512.

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(e) "Waste" means hazardous waste as defined in
 section 11103; solid waste as defined in section 11506; liquid
 industrial waste as defined in section 12101; discharges regu lated by part 31; and air contaminants regulated by part 55.

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5 (f) "Waste reduction" means any practice, such as an equip-6 ment or technology modification, a process or procedure modifica-7 tion, a reformulation or redesign of a product, a substitution of 8 raw materials, or improved management, training, or inventory 9 control, which practice is undertaken by a person to DIRECTLY OR 10 INDIRECTLY reduce the volume or quantity or toxicity of waste 11 that may be released into the environment or that is treated at a 12 location other than the location where it is produced.

13 Sec. 14502. (1) The waste reduction assistance service is
14 created within the department of commerce. The service

15 DEPARTMENT shall inform, assist, educate, and provide funding, as 16 provided in this part, to persons to facilitate a reduction in 17 the amount of waste generated in the state. The service 18 DEPARTMENT shall place a particular emphasis on in-plant waste 19 reduction.

(2) The department shall employ personnel and provide staff
 and services as are necessary to -administer the service and to
 implement this part.

23 Sec. 14503. (1) The service DEPARTMENT shall establish a
24 waste reduction information clearinghouse which shall do all of
25 the following:

26 (a) Upon request, provide specific waste reduction27 information to any person.

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(b) Publish information describing waste reduction
 technologies.

3 (c) Distribute available publications pertaining to waste4 reduction.

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5 (d) Sponsor waste reduction workshops targeted at specific6 industries.

7 (e) Participate in conferences and meetings of business8 organizations.

9 (f) Provide information and application forms as necessary
10 to fulfill the department's responsibilities under sections 14505
11 and 14506.

12 (2) The <u>service</u> DEPARTMENT may contract to have any of the 13 activities provided in subsection (1) performed by persons other 14 than department personnel.

15 Sec. 14504. The <u>service</u> DEPARTMENT shall provide AND 16 SUPPORT technical assistance regarding waste reduction to busi-17 ness and industry throughout the state and shall do all of the 18 following:

19 (a) Provide instruction on self-conducted waste audits per-20 taining to waste reduction.

(b) Provide consultant referrals pertaining to wastereduction.

23 (c) Provide on-site assistance to business and industry per-24 taining to waste reduction.

25 (d) Provide other information and assistance that is consid26 ered appropriate by the <u>service</u> DEPARTMENT.

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Sec. 14505. (1) The department shall establish a waste
 reduction grants program.

3 (2) Information and applications for grants provided by this
4 section shall be distributed upon request through the service
5 DEPARTMENT. Additionally, the service DEPARTMENT shall, upon
6 request, make referrals and provide information about other state
7 agencies and programs and federal agencies and programs where
8 funding alternatives may be available.

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9 (3) An application for a grant under this section shall be
10 on a form provided by the department and contain information as
11 required by the director.

12 (4) The director -, after the consideration of the recommen-13 dations of the committee, shall make waste reduction grants for 14 either or both of the following purposes:

(a) To fund projects that demonstrate new and emerging waste reduction technologies. A grant made under this subdivision shall require that information generated by the project shall be available to the <u>service</u> DEPARTMENT for distribution through the waste reduction information clearinghouse created in section 14503.

21 (b) To fund waste reduction projects.

(5) The director, in making grants pursuant to this section,23 shall consider all of the following:

(a) The severity of the waste problem being addressed.
(b) The extent that the technological development will
reduce waste at its source.

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(c) The potential for the application of the waste reduction
 technology to other persons.

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3 (d) The ability of the applicant to contribute matching4 funds.

5 (e) The percentage reduction of volume or quantity or toxic-6 ity of waste that will be achieved.

7 (f) Whether the project is consistent with state law and8 policy.

9 (g) Additional criteria as the director considers10 appropriate.

Sec. 14506. (1) The department shall establish a wastereduction research grants program.

13 (2) Information and applications for grants under this sec14 tion shall be distributed upon request through the service15 DEPARTMENT.

16 (3) An application for a grant under this section shall be 17 on a form provided by the department and shall contain informa-18 tion required by the director.

19 (4) The director -, after consideration of the recommenda-20 tions of the committee, shall make grants to colleges and uni-21 versities, nonprofit corporations, or industry associations or 22 other persons for industry specific research projects pertaining 23 to waste reduction.

24 (5) The director, in making grants pursuant to this section,25 shall consider all of the following:

26 (a) The severity of the waste problem being addressed.

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(b) The extent that the technological development will
 reduce the volume or quantity or toxicity of waste generated.

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3 (c) The potential for the application of waste reduction4 technology to other persons.

5 (d) The ability of the applicant to contribute matching6 funds.

7 (e) The percentage reduction of volume or quantity or toxic-8 ity of waste that will be achieved.

9 (f) The likelihood of the applicant's project qualifying for10 other research grants or subsequent research grants from other11 sources.

12 (g) Whether the project is consistent with state law and13 policy.

14 (h) Additional criteria as the director considers15 appropriate.

16 Sec. 14510. The <u>service</u> DEPARTMENT shall prepare and 17 deliver, before January 1 of each year, a report detailing the 18 efforts the <u>service</u> DEPARTMENT, INCLUDING RETAP, has undertaken 19 during the previous fiscal year to implement this part. The 20 annual report shall be delivered to the legislature, the gover-21 nor, and the chairpersons of the appropriations committees in the 22 senate and the house of representatives for their use in evaluat-23 ing future appropriations for the service.

24 SEC. 14511. (1) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ESTABLISH A RETIRED
25 ENGINEERS TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM. THE RETAP SHALL PROVIDE
26 ASSISTANCE PURSUANT TO SECTION 14504. RETAP ASSISTANCE SHALL BE

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1 CONDUCTED BY THE RETIRED ENGINEERS, SCIENTISTS, AND OTHER

2 QUALIFIED PROFESSIONALS PARTICIPATING IN RETAP.

3 (2) THE DEPARTMENT MAY CONTRACT WITH PUBLIC OR PRIVATE COR-4 PORATIONS TO CONDUCT 1 OR MORE RETAP ACTIVITIES.

5 (3) THE DIRECTOR MAY ESTABLISH PRIORITIES FOR RETAP ASSIST6 ANCE BASED ON THE DEMAND FOR RETAP ASSISTANCE, THE FUNDS AVAIL7 ABLE FOR THE ASSISTANCE, AND THE NEEDS OF THE APPLICANTS, TAKING
8 INTO CONSIDERATION THE MOST EFFECTIVE USE OF THE ASSISTANCE.

9 SEC. 14512. (1) THE RETIRED ENGINEERS TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE10 PROGRAM FUND IS CREATED WITHIN THE STATE TREASURY.

11 (2) THE STATE TREASURER MAY RECEIVE MONEY OR OTHER ASSETS
12 FROM ANY SOURCE FOR DEPOSIT INTO THE RETAP FUND. THE STATE TREA13 SURER SHALL DIRECT THE INVESTMENT OF THE RETAP FUND. THE STATE
14 TREASURER SHALL CREDIT TO THE RETAP FUND INTEREST AND EARNINGS
15 FROM FUND INVESTMENTS.

16 (3) THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF MONEY IN THE RETAP FUND SHALL NOT 17 EXCEED \$10,000,000.00.

18 (4) TO CAPITALIZE THE RETAP FUND, \$700,000.00 FROM FEES COL19 LECTED UNDER SECTION 11108 IS APPROPRIATED AND TRANSFERRED FROM
20 THE GENERAL FUND TO THE RETAP FUND.

(5) MONEY IN THE RETAP FUND AT THE CLOSE OF THE FISCAL YEAR
22 SHALL REMAIN IN THE RETAP FUND AND SHALL NOT LAPSE TO THE GENERAL
23 FUND.

24 (6) THE STATE TREASURER SHALL ANNUALLY REPORT TO THE LEGIS-25 LATURE ON THE AMOUNT OF MONEY IN THE RETAP FUND.

26 (7) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL EXPEND MONEY FROM THE RETAP FUND,27 UPON APPROPRIATION, TO ADMINISTER AND OPERATE THE RETAP.

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Enacting section 1. Sections 14305, 14507, 14508, and 14509 1 2 of the natural resources and environmental protection act, 1994 **3** PA 451, MCL 324.14305, 324.14507, 324.14508, and 324.14509, are **4** repealed.

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
