SENATE BILL No. 977

EXECUTIVE BUDGET BILL

February 3, 2000, Introduced by Senators MC MANUS, GAST, HOFFMAN and JOHNSON and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to make appropriations for the department of natural resources for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2001; to provide for the expenditure of those appropriations; to create funds and accounts; to require reports; to prescribe certain powers and duties of certain state agencies and officials; to authorize certain transfers by certain state agencies; and to provide for the disposition of fees and other income received by the various state agencies.

- 6 Grants to counties marine safety 3,230,000

- 9 (2) If it appears to the principal executive officer of a
- 10 department or branch that state spending to local units of government
- 11 will be less than the amount that was projected to be expended for any
- 12 quarter under subsection (1), the principal executive officer shall
- 13 immediately give notice of the approximate shortfall to the state
- 14 budget director, the senate and house of representatives standing

- 17 Sec. 202. The expenditures and funding sources authorized under
- 18 this bill are subject to the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431,
- 19 MCL 18.1101 to 18.1594.
- 20 Sec. 203. As used in this bill:
- 21 (a) "Commission" means the Michigan commission of natural
- 22 resources.
- 23 (b) "DAG" means the United States department of Agriculture.
- 24 (c) "Department" means the Michigan department of natural
- 25 resources.
- 26 (d) "DOC" means the United States department of commerce.
- 27 (e) "DOD" means the United States department of defense.
- 28 (f) "DOE" means the United States department of energy.
- 29 (g) "DOI" means the United States department of interior.
- 30 (h) "DOI-MMS" means DOI minerals management service.

- (i) "DOT" means the United States department of transportation.
- 2 (j) "EPA" means the United States environmental protection agency.
- 3 (k) "FTE" means full-time equated.
- 4 (1) "IDG" means the interdepartmental grant.
- 5 (m) "IDT" means the intradepartmental transfer.
- 6 (n) "IGLFC" means international Great Lakes fish commission.
- 7 Sec. 204. (1) Beginning October 1, a hiring freeze is imposed on
- 8 the state classified civil service. State departments and agencies
- 9 are prohibited from hiring any new full-time state classified civil
- 10 service employees and prohibited from filling any vacant state
- 11 classified civil service positions. This hiring freeze does not apply
- 12 to internal transfers of classified employees from one position to
- 13 another within a department or to positions that are funded with 80%
- 14 or more federal or restricted funds.
- 15 (2) The state budget director shall grant exceptions to
- 16 this hiring freeze when the state budget director believes that the
- 17 hiring freeze will result in rendering a state department or agency
- 18 unable to deliver basic services. The state budget director shall
- 19 report by the 30^{TH} of each month to the chairpersons of the senate and
- 20 house of representatives standing committees on appropriations the
- 21 number of exceptions to the hiring freeze approved during the previous
- 22 month and the reasons to justify the exception.
- Sec. 205. The department of civil service shall bill departments
- 24 and agencies at the end of the first fiscal quarter for the 1% charge
- 25 authorized by section 5 of article XI of the state constitution of
- 26 1963. Payments shall be made for the total amount of the billing by
- 27 the end of the second fiscal quarter.
- 28 Sec. 206. (1) In addition to the funds appropriated in
- 29 part 1, there is appropriated an amount not to exceed \$2,000,000.00
- 30 for federal contingency funds. These funds are not available for

- 1 expenditure until they have been transferred to another line item in
- 2 this bill pursuant to section 393(2) of the management and budget act,
- 3 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.
- 4 (2) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is
- 5 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$10,000,000.00 for state
- 6 restricted contingency funds. These funds are not available for
- 7 expenditure until they have been transferred to another line item in
- 8 this bill pursuant to section 393(2) of the management and budget act,
- 9 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.
- 10 (3) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is
- 11 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$100,000.00 for local contingency
- 12 funds. These funds are not available for expenditure until they have
- 13 been transferred to another line item in this bill pursuant to section
- 14 393(2) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.
- 15 (4) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is
- 16 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$250,000.00 for private
- 17 contingency funds. These funds are not available for expenditure
- 18 until they have been transferred to another line item in this bill
- 19 pursuant to section 393 (2) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA
- 20 431, MCL 18.1393.
- 21 Sec. 207. The department shall provide the state budget director,
- 22 the senate and house appropriations subcommittees on natural
- 23 resources, and the senate and house fiscal agencies with an annual
- 24 report on restricted fund balance, projected revenues, and
- 25 expenditures.
- 26 Sec. 208. The department shall continue to pilot the use of the
- 27 Internet to fulfill the reporting requirements in this bill. This may
- 28 include transmission of reports via electronic mail to the recipients
- 29 identified for each reporting requirement or it may include placement
- 30 of reports on the Internet or on the Intranet. The appropriations

- 1 subcommittee shall be notified in writing of the Internet/Intranet
- 2 site of any such report.
- 3 Sec. 209. Sixty days before beginning any effort to privatize,
- 4 the department shall submit a complete project plan to the appropriate
- 5 subcommittees of the senate and house of representatives standing
- 6 committees on appropriations and the senate and house fiscal agencies.
- 7 The plan shall include the criteria under which the privatization
- 8 initiative will be evaluated. The evaluation shall be completed and
- 9 submitted to the appropriate subcommittees of the senate and house of
- 10 representatives standing committees on appropriations and the senate
- 11 and house fiscal agencies within 30 months.

12 **EXECUTIVE**

- 13 Sec. 301. The appropriations in part 1 for the commission may be
- 14 used for per diem payments to the members of commissions or committees
- 15 for a full day of commission or committee work at which a quorum is
- 16 present, for attending a hearing as authorized by the respective
- 17 commission or committee, or for performing official business as
- 18 authorized by each respective commission or committee. The per diem
- 19 payment for members of the commission of natural resources shall be
- 20 \$75.00.

- Sec. 401. The following are the estimated general purpose
- 23 revenues available in the game and fish protection fund for the state
- 24 fiscal year beginning October 1, 2000:
- 25 Projected balance from previous year \$ 3,100,000
- 27 Game and fish protection trust fund interest and

- 30 Miscellaneous revenues 950,000

- 1 Total general purpose game and fish protection
- 3 Sec. 402. Of the state general fund/general purpose resources
- 4 appropriated in part 1 to administrative services, \$2,210,000.00 is
- 5 for the game and fish protection fund to provide senior citizen
- 6 license fee reimbursement under section 43546 of the natural resources
- 7 and environmental protection act, 1994 PA 451, MCL 324.43546.

8 WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT

- 9 Sec. 501. Of the funds appropriated in part 1, the department
- 10 shall reimburse the department of agriculture for costs incurred for
- 11 indemnification payments for livestock losses caused by wolves under
- 12 the animal industry act of 1987, 1988 PA 466, MCL 287.701 to 287.747.

13 FISHERIES MANAGEMENT

- 14 Sec. 601. The department shall not impede the certification
- 15 process for water control structures on Michigan waterways. All
- 16 certification conditions necessary for compliance with section
- 17 401 of title IV of the federal water pollution control act, chapter
- 18 758, 86 stat. 877, 33 U.S.C. 1341, that are required or requested by
- 19 the department shall be paid for, by the department, from funds
- 20 appropriated in part 1.

21 PARKS AND RECREATION

- Sec. 701. The department may charge the appropriations contained
- 23 in part 1, including all special maintenance and capital projects
- 24 appropriated for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2001, for
- 25 engineering services provided, a standard percentage fee to recover
- 26 actual costs, and may use the revenue derived to support the
- 27 engineering services charges provided for in part 1.
- 28 Sec. 702. In accordance with section 1902(2) of the natural
- 29 resources and environmental protection act, 1994 PA 451, MCL 324.1902,
- 30 there is appropriated from the Michigan natural resources trust fund

- 1 to the Michigan state parks endowment fund an amount not to exceed
- 2 \$10,000,000.00 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2001.

3 FOREST RESOURCES MANAGEMENT

- 4 Sec. 801. The commission may establish and collect fees for the
- 5 processing of applications for the use of state forests that require
- 6 extensive review. The fees shall cover the cost to the department of
- 7 processing the applications. Any unexpended application fees for the
- 8 use of state forests, along with any excess collections from
- 9 prior fiscal years, shall be carried over into subsequent fiscal years
- 10 and shall be available for appropriation.
- 11 Sec. 802. Of the funds appropriated in part 1, the department
- 12 shall not allow the amount of timber marked for harvest to decrease
- 13 below 855,000 cords or 60,000 treated acres provided that the
- 14 department takes into consideration the impact of timber harvesting on
- 15 wildlife habitat and recreation uses.
- 16 Sec. 803. The appropriation in part 1 for abandoned mine shaft
- 17 closures shall be used to restrict access to or cap abandoned mine
- 18 shafts in order of priority as determined by the department.
- 19 Sec. 804. With money received from the sale of timber on state
- 20 land and appropriated in part 1, the department may employ an
- 21 additional 20 full-time temporary employees to serve as firefighters
- 22 for the 6-month period in which the risk of forest fires is the
- 23 highest.

24 LAND AND MINERAL SERVICES

- 25 Sec. 901. The department may charge land acquisition project
- 26 appropriated for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2001, and for
- 27 prior fiscal years, a standard percentage fee to recover actual costs,
- 28 and may use the revenue derived to support the land acquisition
- 29 service charges provided for in part 1.
- 30 Sec. 902. The land sale fund is created. An amount equal to the

- 1 cost of personal services, printing, postage, advertising, contractual
- 2 services, and facility rental associated with tax reverted lands shall
- 3 be deducted from the sales and credited to the land sale fund.

4 GRANTS

- 5 Sec. 1001. The amount appropriated in part 1 for federal-rural
- 6 community fire protection shall be awarded as grants to local fire
- 7 protection departments. To be eligible, local fire protection
- 8 departments shall be located in governmental units or fire protection
- 9 districts with permanent populations of less than 10,000 and with
- 10 1,000 or more acres of publicly owned forested land.
