Sec. 32q of the State School Aid Act appropriates \$38 million for FY 2000-01 and FY 2002-02 and \$50 million for FY 2002-03 to provide summer school instruction for students who have demonstrated the need for additional instruction in reading or math. HB 4618 allows districts to use the grant funds provided under Section 32g for before- and after-school programs in addition to or instead of summer school programs to enhance basic literacy or math skills.

Since funding for Section 32g grants has already been appropriated, simply allowing a new use for the funds will not create increased costs to the state. However, if enough districts receive grants for before- and after-school programs, there may be insufficient dollars to fund all of the districts seeking summer school grants.
