

**SENATE SUBSTITUTE FOR
HOUSE BILL NO. 4878**

A bill to consolidate prior acts naming certain Michigan highways; to provide for the naming of certain highways; to prescribe certain duties of the state transportation department; and to repeal acts and parts of acts and certain resolutions.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
2 "Michigan memorial highway act".

3 Sec. 2. The state transportation department shall only pro-
4 vide for the erection and maintenance of suitable markers at the
5 approach of any of the highways described in this act when suffi-
6 cient private contributions are received to pay the cost of
7 erecting and maintaining those markers.

8 Sec. 3. The portion of highways US-223 beginning at the
9 intersection with US-23, M-34, and M-99 extending northwest

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1 through Monroe, Lenawee, Hillsdale, and Calhoun counties to the
2 city of Homer shall be known as "Carleton Road".

3 Sec. 4. The portion of highway I-75 and US-23 beginning in
4 the city of Saginaw and extending north to the city of Bay City
5 shall be known as the "Roberts-Linton Highway" and as the
6 "Veterans of World War I Memorial Highway".

7 Sec. 5. The portion of highway M-43 beginning in the city
8 of East Lansing and extending west to the city of Grand Ledge
9 shall be known as the "Frank D. Fitzgerald Memorial Highway".

10 Sec. 6. Highway M-53 extending from the city of Detroit
11 north to M-25 in Huron county shall be known as the "Earle
12 Memorial Highway".

13 Sec. 7. The portion of highway US-23 beginning at the
14 border between Michigan and Ohio in Monroe county and extending
15 north to the city of Mackinaw City shall be known as the "United
16 Spanish War Veterans' Memorial Highway".

17 Sec. 8. The portion of US-2 beginning in St. Ignace and
18 extending west to Gladstone, the portion of M-35 beginning in
19 Gladstone and extending south to Wells, the portion of US-2 and
20 M-41 beginning at Wells and extending west to Hermansville, the
21 portion of US-2 beginning at Hermansville and extending west to
22 Iron Mountain, the portion of M-95 beginning at Iron Mountain and
23 extending north to Sagola, the portion of M-69 beginning at
24 Sagola and extending west to Crystal Falls, and the portion of
25 US-2 beginning in Crystal Falls and extending west to Ironwood
26 shall be known as the "United Spanish War Veterans' Memorial
27 Highway".

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1 Sec. 9. The portion of highway M-95 beginning at the border
2 between Michigan and Wisconsin in Dickinson county and extending
3 north to Champion in Marquette county shall be known as the "Leif
4 Erikson Memorial Highway".

5 Sec. 10. Highway M-107 in Ontonagon county shall be known
6 as the "107th Engineer Memorial Road".

7 Sec. 11. The portion of highway US-31 beginning at the
8 border between Michigan and Indiana in Berrien county and extend-
9 ing to the Straits of Mackinac at the county line of Emmet and
10 Cheboygan counties shall be known as the "Blue Star Memorial
11 Highway".

12 Sec. 12. The portion of highway US-12 beginning at highway
13 M-1 in the city of Detroit and extending west to Lake Michigan
14 shall be known as the "Pulaski Memorial Highway".

15 Sec. 13. The portion of M-125 beginning at the border
16 between Michigan and Ohio in Monroe county and extending north to
17 the intersection with US-24 and the portion of US-24 beginning at
18 the intersection of M-125 and extending north to I-96 in Wayne
19 county shall be known as the "Clara Barton Memorial Highway".

20 Sec. 14. The part of highway US-31 beginning at the county
21 line of Muskegon and Oceana counties and extending north to the
22 county line of Mason and Manistee counties shall be known as the
23 "Pere Marquette Memorial Highway".

24 Sec. 15. The portion of M-102 from the intersection with
25 Grand River avenue in the city of Farmington and extending east
26 to M-3 in Macomb county shall be known as the "Columbus Memorial
27 Highway".

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1 Sec. 16. The portion of highway US-2 and highway US-41 and
2 highway M-35 beginning at the northern city limit of Escanaba and
3 extending north 1-1/10 miles to the junction of County Road
4 No. 426, also known as the extension of Sheridan avenue, shall be
5 known as the "AmVets Memorial Drive".

6 Sec. 17. (1) The portion of highway M-66 beginning at the
7 intersection with highway M-78 in Calhoun county and extending
8 north to the intersection with highway US-131 in Kalkaska county
9 shall be known as the "Green Arrow Route".

10 (2) The portion of highway US-131 beginning at the border
11 between Michigan and Indiana in St. Joseph county and extending
12 north to the intersection with highway M-66 in Kalkaska county
13 shall be known as the "Mackinac Trail".

14 (3) The portion of highway US-131 beginning at the intersec-
15 tion with highway M-66 and extending north to the intersection
16 with highway US-31 and the portion of highway US-31 beginning at
17 the intersection with highway US-131 and extending north to the
18 straits of Mackinac shall be known as the "Green Arrow
19 Route-Mackinac Trail".

20 Sec. 18. The portion of highway business loop I-94 located
21 in Kalamazoo county shall be known as the "AmVets Memorial
22 Parkway".

23 Sec. 19. The portion of highway M-10 located in Oakland
24 county between the intersections of US-24 and M-102 shall be
25 known as the "Adler Memorial Highway".

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1 Sec. 20. The portion of highway I-75 beginning at the
2 Michigan-Ohio state line and extending north to Sault Ste. Marie
3 shall be known as the "American Legion Memorial Highway".

4 Sec. 21. The portion of highway I-475 that is in Genesee
5 county shall be known as the "David Dunbar Buick Freeway" and
6 "The UAW Freeway".

7 Sec. 22. The portion of highway I-69 beginning at the
8 Shiawassee-Genesee county line and extending east to the Genesee-
9 Lapeer county line shall be known as the "Louis Chevrolet
10 Freeway".

11 Sec. 23. Highway I-696 in Oakland and Macomb counties shall
12 be known as the "Walter P. Reuther Highway".

13 Sec. 24. The highway interchange at highway I-75 and high-
14 way M-8 shall be known as the "Charles J. Rogers Interchange".

15 Sec. 25. That portion of highway I-496 that is within the
16 city limits of the city of Lansing shall be known as the "Olds
17 Freeway".

18 Sec. 26. Highway I-196 in Kent, Ottawa, and Allegan coun-
19 ties shall be known as the "Gerald R. Ford Freeway".

20 Sec. 27. The portion of highway I-75 in Cheboygan and
21 Mackinac counties shall be known as the "G. Mennen Williams
22 Highway" and the "Prentiss M. Brown Memorial Highway".

23 Sec. 28. The portion of highway M-66 that is in Calhoun
24 county shall be known as the "Sojourner Truth Memorial Highway".

25 Sec. 29. Highway I-275 beginning at the intersection of
26 I-275 and I-75 in Monroe county and extending north to I-69 in

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1 Oakland county shall be known as the "Philip A. Hart Memorial
2 Highway".

3 Sec. 30. The portion of highway M-59 beginning at the east-
4 ern city limit of the city of Pontiac and extending east to the
5 western city limit of the city of Utica shall be known as the
6 "Veterans Memorial Freeway".

7 Sec. 31. The portion of highway M-53 beginning at the
8 northern city limit of the city of Sterling Heights and extending
9 north to the village of Washington in Macomb county shall be
10 known as the "Christopher Columbus Freeway".

11 Sec. 32. The portion of highway I-69 between the western
12 city limit of the city of Flint and the eastern city limit of the
13 city of Port Huron shall be known as the "Veterans Memorial
14 Highway".

15 Sec. 33. Highway I-69 in Genesee county shall be known as
16 the "Chevrolet-Buick Freeway".

17 Sec. 34. The portion of highway I-69 beginning at the east-
18 ern city limit of the city of Lapeer and extending east to the
19 western city limit of the city of Port Huron shall be known as
20 the "DeWayne T. Williams Memorial Highway".

21 Sec. 35. The portion of highway I-75 within the state of
22 Michigan shall be known as the "American Legion Memorial
23 Highway".

24 Sec. 36. Highway I-94 business loop in the city of Albion
25 shall be known as the "Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Memorial
26 Highway".

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1 Sec. 37. Highway M-28 beginning at the intersection with
2 highway M-123 in Chippewa county and extending west to the east
3 city limit of the city of Negaunee shall be known as the
4 "Jacobetti Highway".

5 Sec. 38. Highway M-121 in Genesee county shall be known as
6 the "Disabled American Veterans Highway".

7 Sec. 39. The portion of highway M-96 beginning at the
8 intersection with business loop I-94 in the city of Kalamazoo and
9 extending east to the village of Augusta shall be known as the
10 "Fort Custer Memorial Highway".

11 Sec. 40. Highway M-125 in Monroe county shall be known as
12 "Veterans Memorial Road".

13 Sec. 41. Highway US-31, business route, also known as
14 Seaway Drive, beginning at the intersection with Spring street in
15 Muskegon and continuing to the intersection with Getty street in
16 Muskegon shall be known as the "Moses J. Jones Parkway".

17 Sec. 42. The portion of highway M-59 from the intersection
18 with I-96 in Livingston county and extending east to the inter-
19 section with I-94 in Macomb county, excluding the section of
20 highway M-59 between the city of Pontiac and the city of Utica,
21 shall be known as the "Vietnam Veterans Memorial Highway".

22 Sec. 43. Highway I-96 extending from Wayne county west to
23 Muskegon county shall be known as the "AmVets Memorial Highway".

24 Sec. 44. The portion of highway I-75 that is within Wayne
25 and Oakland counties shall be known as the "Walter P. Chrysler
26 Freeway".

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1 Sec. 45. The portion of highway M-38 beginning at the
2 Ontonagon village limit and extending east to the Houghton county
3 line shall be known as the "Joseph H. Meagher Memorial Highway".

4 Sec. 46. The portion of highway US-127 beginning at the
5 north county line of Jackson county and extending south to the
6 intersection with highway I-94 shall be known as the
7 "Haskell L. Nichols Memorial Highway".

8 Sec. 47. Highway M-117 between M-28 and US-2 in Mackinac
9 county is named in honor of the 117th quartermaster battalion.

10 Sec. 48. Highway US-12 in Wayne county extending west to
11 the Michigan-Indiana state line in Berrien county shall be known
12 as the "Iron Brigade Memorial Highway".

13 Sec. 49. The portion of highway US-31 beginning at the
14 Michigan-Indiana state line and extending north to the intersec-
15 tion with I-94 in Berrien county shall be known as the
16 "St. Joseph Valley Parkway".

17 Sec. 50. The portion of highway M-37 beginning at the
18 intersection with US-10 in Lake county and extending north to the
19 county line of Lake county and Wexford county shall be known as
20 the "World War II Veterans Memorial Highway".

21 Sec. 51. Highway I-275 north of the Livonia intersection of
22 I-275 and I-96 shall be known as the "Disabled American Veterans
23 Memorial Highway".

24 Sec. 52. The portion of highway M-85 located in the city of
25 Detroit between Outer drive and highway I-75 shall also be known
26 as "Matt McNeely Boulevard".

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1 Sec. 53. Highway M-6 located in Kent and Ottawa counties
2 shall be known as the "Paul B. Henry Freeway".

3 Sec. 54. The part of highway M-5 located in the city of
4 Farmington Hills and the city of Farmington extending from the
5 interchange of highways I-96, I-275, and I-696 east to the inter-
6 section with M-102 shall be known as the "Keith Deacon Memorial
7 Highway".

8 Sec. 55. The part of the bypass of highway US-131 that is
9 located between M-115 and Boon road in Wexford county shall be
10 known as the "Sydney Ouwinga Memorial Bypass".

11 Sec. 56. The part of highway M-33 located in Ogemaw and
12 Oscoda counties between Houghton Creek road and Miller road shall
13 be known as the "Veterans' Memorial Drive".

14 Sec. 57. The part of highway M-32 between Ripley boulevard
15 and Bagley street in the city of Alpena shall be known as the
16 "Veterans' Memorial Highway".

17 Sec. 58. Highway M-109 located in Leelanau county shall be
18 known as the "D. H. Day Highway".

19 Sec. 59. The portion of highway I-69 beginning at exit 105
20 in Shiawasee county and extending east to exit 135 in Genesee
21 county shall be known as the "Pearl Harbor Memorial Highway".

Sec. 60. The overpass located at the intersection of highway
I-75 and highway M-57 in Genesee County shall be known as the
"Bernie Borden Memorial Overpass".

Sec. 61. Highway M-120 in Muskegon county beginning at the
intersection of Highway M-120, Lake avenue and Whitehall road, and
extending south for 1 mile shall be known as the "Veteran's Memorial
Causeway".

Sec. 62. The portion of highway I-94 lying within Macomb and
St. Clair counties shall be known as the "James G. O'Hara Freeway".

Sec. 63. The portion of highway business route US-27 beginning
at Polk road in Emerson Township in Gratiot County, continuing south
through the city of Ithaca to Center road, and continuing east to
the intersection of highway business route US-27 and US-27 in
Emerson Township in Gratiot County shall be named the "Veteran's
Memorial Highway".
