

SUBSTITUTE FOR  
HOUSE BILL NO. 5649

A bill to make, supplement, and adjust appropriations for the department of military and veterans affairs for the fiscal years ending September 30, 2002 and September 30, 2003; to provide for the expenditure of the appropriations; to provide for certain powers and duties of the department of military and veterans affairs, other state agencies, and local units of government related to the appropriations; and to provide for the preparation of certain reports related to the appropriations.

### 23 PROVISIONS CONCERNING APPROPRIATIONS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2002-2003

### 24 GENERAL SECTIONS

25 Sec. 201. Pursuant to section 30 of article IX of the state  
26 constitution of 1963, total state spending from state resources under  
27 part 1 for fiscal year 2002-2003 is \$59,893,100.00 and state spending



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1 from state resources to be paid to local units of government for fiscal  
2 year 2002-2003 is \$120,000.00. The itemized statement below identifies  
3 appropriations from which spending to units of local government will  
4 occur:

11 Sec. 202. The appropriations authorized under this act are subject  
12 to the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101 to 18.1594.

13 Sec. 203. As used in this act:

14 (a) "Department" means the department of military and veterans  
15 affairs.

16 (b) "Director" means the director of the department of military and  
17 veterans affairs.

18 (c) "DOD" means the United States department of defense.

19 (d) "DOD-DOA-NGB" means the DOD department of the army, national  
20 guard bureau.

21 (e) "DVA" means the United States department of veterans' affairs.

22 (f) "DVA-VHA" means the DVA veterans' health administration.

23 (g) "FTE" means full-time equated.

24 (h) "HHS" means the United States department of health and human  
25 services.

26 (i) "HHS-HCFA" means the HHS health care financing administration.

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1 (j) "IDG" means interdepartmental grant.

2 Sec. 204. The department of civil service shall bill departments  
3 and agencies at the end of the first fiscal quarter for the 1% charge  
4 authorized by section 5 of article XI of the state constitution of 1963.  
5 Payments shall be made for the total amount of the billing by the end of  
6 the second fiscal quarter.

7 Sec. 205. (1) Beginning October 1, a hiring freeze is imposed on  
8 the state classified civil service. State departments and agencies are  
9 prohibited from hiring any new full-time state classified civil service  
10 employees and prohibited from filling any vacant state classified civil  
11 service positions. This hiring freeze does not apply to internal trans-  
12 fers of classified employees from 1 position to another within a  
13 department.

14 (2) The state budget director shall grant exceptions to this hiring  
15 freeze when the state budget director believes that the hiring freeze  
16 will result in rendering a state department or agency unable to deliver  
17 basic services, cause loss of revenue to the state, result in the inabil-  
18 ity of the state to receive federal funds, or necessitate additional  
19 expenditures that exceed any savings from maintaining a vacancy. The  
20 state budget director shall report by the last business day of each month  
21 to the chairpersons of the senate and house of representatives standing  
22 committees on appropriations the number of exceptions to the hiring  
23 freeze approved during the previous month and the justification for the  
24 exception.

25 Sec. 206. (1) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1,  
26 there is appropriated an amount not to exceed \$5,000,000.00 for federal  
27 contingency funds. These funds are not available for expenditure until

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1 they have been transferred to another line item in this act under  
2 section 393(2) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431,  
3 MCL 18.1393.

4 (2) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is appro-  
5 priated an amount not to exceed \$2,000,000.00 for state restricted con-  
6 tingency funds. These funds are not available for expenditure until they  
7 have been transferred to another line item in this act under  
8 section 393(2) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431,  
9 MCL 18.1393.

10 (3) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is appro-  
11 priated an amount not to exceed \$100,000.00 for local contingency funds.  
12 These funds are not available for expenditure until they have been trans-  
13 ferred to another line item in this act under section 393(2) of the man-  
14 agement and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.

15 (4) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is appro-  
16 priated an amount not to exceed \$100,000.00 for private contingency  
17 funds. These funds are not available for expenditure until they have  
18 been transferred to another line item in this act under section 393(2) of  
19 the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.

20 Sec. 207. Sixty days before beginning any effort to privatize, the  
21 department shall submit a complete project plan to the appropriate senate  
22 and house of representatives appropriations subcommittees and the senate  
23 and house fiscal agencies. The plan shall include the criteria under  
24 which the privatization initiative will be evaluated. The evaluation  
25 shall be completed and submitted to the appropriate senate and house of  
26 representatives appropriations subcommittees and the senate and house  
27 fiscal agencies within 30 months.

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1       Sec. 208. Unless otherwise specified, the department shall use the  
2 Internet to fulfill the reporting requirements of this act. This may  
3 include transmission of reports via electronic mail to the recipients  
4 identified for each reporting requirement or it may include placement of  
5 reports on an Internet or Intranet site.

6       Sec. 209. Funds appropriated in part 1 shall not be used for the  
7 purchase of foreign goods or services, or both, if competitively priced  
8 and of comparable quality American goods or services, or both, are  
9 available.

10       Sec. 210. The director of each department receiving appropriations  
11 in part 1 shall take all reasonable steps to ensure businesses in  
12 deprived and depressed communities compete for and perform contracts to  
13 provide services or supplies, or both. Each director shall strongly  
14 encourage firms with which the department contracts to subcontract with  
15 certified businesses in depressed and deprived communities for services,  
16 supplies, or both.

17       Sec. 211. The department shall create and retain reports for all  
18 money appropriated under part 1.

19       Sec. 212. (1) Of the funds appropriated in section 103 for military  
20 training sites and support facilities, there shall be established a  
21 Michigan national guard education assistance program. Disbursements to  
22 the educational assistance program shall not exceed \$1,300,000.00 without  
23 legislative approval. Under the program, a member of the national guard  
24 who is in active service and who enrolls as a full- or part-time student  
25 at a public or private state college or university may be eligible to  
26 receive up to an equivalent of 50% of the total cost of tuition not to  
27 exceed \$2,000.00, as education assistance, in any academic year.

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1       (2) An eligible person means a member of the Michigan national guard  
2 who is in active service, as defined in section 105 of the Michigan mili-  
3 tary act, 1967 PA 150, MCL 32.505. An eligible person does not include a  
4 member of the Michigan national guard or air national guard who is absent  
5 without leave or who is under charges as described in the Michigan code  
6 of military justice of 1980, 1980 PA 523, MCL 32.1001 to 32.1148.

7       (3) The department of military and veterans affairs, office of the  
8 adjutant general shall administer the education assistance program and  
9 prescribe forms and procedures to effectively carry out the education  
10 assistance program.

11       (4) An eligible person shall apply to the department of military and  
12 veterans affairs, office of the adjutant general for education assistance  
13 and shall provide evidence of attendance and completion of the course of  
14 study with a grade of at least 2.0 on a 4.0 scale, or its equivalent.  
15 The adjutant general shall approve the application for reimbursement if  
16 the applicant meets the definition of an eligible person under  
17 subsection (2) and other criteria as established by the adjutant  
18 general.

19       (5) The education assistance program applies to any course of  
20 instruction that is included in an associate, undergraduate, or postgrad-  
21 uate degree program offered by a college or university of this state.

22       (6) The education assistance program applies to an eligible person  
23 notwithstanding any other educational incentive or benefit received by  
24 the eligible person under any other educational assistance program pro-  
25 vided by any other state.

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1       (7) An eligible person who successfully completes the course of  
2 study with a grade of at least 2.0 on a 4.0 scale, or its equivalent,  
3 shall be eligible for reimbursement.

4       (8) The department of military and veterans affairs may use funds  
5 from the appropriated funds to administer the education assistance  
6 program.

7       (9) Reimbursed members who do not complete their national guard  
8 obligation shall pay the state for money received from the state for  
9 tuition. Members who fail to repay the state within the time limits  
10 established by the adjutant general shall be indebted to the state. The  
11 department shall work in conjunction with the department of treasury for  
12 inclusion in the tax intercept program for amounts due the state.

13       (10) A portion of the funds for the Michigan national guard educa-  
14 tion assistance program may be used by the department for the purpose of  
15 promoting the program and for encouraging those persons the department  
16 wishes to have enlist or reenlist in the Michigan national guard.

17       Sec. 213. The department shall consult with the house and senate  
18 appropriations subcommittees on military and veterans affairs regarding  
19 the projected closing or consolidation of any national guard armories.

20       Sec. 259. From the funds appropriated in part 1 for information  
21 technology, the department shall pay user fees to the department of  
22 information technology for technology-related services and projects.  
23 User fees shall be subject to provisions of an interagency agreement  
24 between the department and the department of information technology.

25       Sec. 260. Amounts appropriated in part 1 for information technology  
26 may be designated as work projects and carried forward to support  
27 technology projects under the direction of the department of information

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1 technology. Funds designated in this manner are not available for  
2 expenditure until approved as work projects under section 451a of the  
3 management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1451a.

### 4 HEADQUARTERS AND ARMORIES

5 Sec. 301. The department may charge reasonable rental and equipment  
6 usage fees for renting an armory or using the distance learning network.  
7 The fee shall include the cost of overtime compensation, insurance cover-  
8 age, and any maintenance required.

9 Sec. 302. (1) The funds appropriated in this act for private dona-  
10 tions to the challenge program shall be considered state restricted reve-  
11 nue, and unexpended funds remaining at the close of the fiscal year shall  
12 not lapse to the general fund but shall be carried forward to the subse-  
13 quent fiscal year.

14 (2) The department may charge a parent or guardian of a participant  
15 in the challenge program a fee for participating in the program if the  
16 participant is a member of a family with an income that exceeds 400% of  
17 the federal poverty guidelines as published by the United States depart-  
18 ment of health and human services. The amount charged the parent or  
19 guardian shall not exceed the per student state share cost of administer-  
20 ing the program. The parent or guardian shall be notified of any charge  
21 to be assessed under this subsection prior to enrollment of the child in  
22 the program.

23 Sec. 304. The department will partner with the family independence  
24 agency to identify youth who may be eligible for the challenge program

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1 from those youth served by family independence agency programs. Such  
2 eligible youth shall be given priority for enrollment in the program.

### 3 VETERANS SERVICE ORGANIZATIONS

4 Sec. 501. (1) Money appropriated in section 105 for grants to vet-  
5 erans service organizations shall be used only for salaries, wages,  
6 related personnel costs, training, and equipment for accredited veteran  
7 service advocacy officers and necessary support and managerial staff.  
8 Training shall be provided for service advocacy officers and shall be  
9 conducted by accredited advocacy officers.

10 (2) To receive a grant from the money appropriated in section 105, a  
11 veterans service organization shall meet the following eligibility  
12 requirements:

13 (a) Be congressionally chartered by the United States Congress.

14 (b) Be an active participating member of the Michigan veterans  
15 organizations' rehabilitation and veterans service committee and abide by  
16 its rules, guidelines, and programs.

17 (c) Demonstrate the receipt of monetary or service support from its  
18 own organization.

19 (d) Comply with the department's and the legislature's requirements  
20 of accounting audits, service work activity, accounting of recoveries,  
21 listing of volunteer hours, budget requests, and other requirements spec-  
22 ified in subsection (3).

23 (e) For a veterans service organization founded after September 30,  
24 1989, be in operation and providing service to Michigan veterans for not  
25 less than 2 years before receiving an initial state grant. During this



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1 2-year period of time, the organization shall file a listing of service  
2 work activity and an accounting of recoveries with the department, the  
3 senate and house fiscal agencies, the senate and house of representatives  
4 appropriations subcommittees on military affairs, and the state budget  
5 office on forms as prescribed by the department.

6 (3) A veterans service organization receiving a grant from the money  
7 appropriated in section 105 shall file with the department an accounting  
8 of its expenditures, audited and certified by a certified public accoun-  
9 tant, within 120 days after the organization's fiscal year end. Each  
10 organization shall provide a detailed budget request for the fiscal year  
11 ending September 30, 2004, to the department by November 15, 2002, within  
12 the format as prescribed by the department to be used in the development  
13 of the budget for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2004. Each veter-  
14 ans service organization shall provide 5 copies of a listing of all serv-  
15 ice activity, an accounting of recoveries, and a listing of volunteer  
16 hours for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2002, to the department by  
17 January 31, 2003. The listing of volunteer hours shall include the  
18 hours, services, and donations provided to residents of the Grand Rapids  
19 veterans' home and the D.J. Jacobetti veterans' home. Each veterans  
20 service organization shall provide a copy of the most recent and com-  
21 pleted internal revenue service form 990 to the department at the end of  
22 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2002. A veterans service organiza-  
23 tion receiving a grant from the money appropriated in section 105 shall  
24 use the forms recommended by the Michigan veterans organizations' reha-  
25 bilitation and veterans service committee for filing reports required by  
26 this act. The department shall forward information required under this  
27 section to the senate and house fiscal agencies, the senate and house of

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1 representatives appropriations subcommittees on military affairs, and the  
2 state budget office.

### 3 VETERANS' HOMES

4 Sec. 601. Appropriations in this act for the Grand Rapids veterans'  
5 home and the D.J. Jacobetti veterans' home shall not be used for any pur-  
6 pose other than for veterans and veterans' families.

7 Sec. 602. The Grand Rapids veterans' home and the D.J. Jacobetti  
8 veterans' home, together with the department and the department of man-  
9 agement and budget, shall produce and deliver to the senate and house of  
10 representatives appropriations subcommittees on state police and military  
11 affairs an annual written report. The report shall include an accounting  
12 of member populations and bed space available; a description and account-  
13 ing of services and activities provided to members; financial informa-  
14 tion; current state nursing home licensure status; the steps required for  
15 Medicaid certification, including a listing of any personnel, equipment,  
16 supplies, or budgetary increases required; and whether or not steps are  
17 being taken toward Medicaid certification. The annual report shall be  
18 submitted to the senate and house of representatives appropriations sub-  
19 committees on military affairs no later than February 1, 2003.

20 Sec. 603. The money appropriated in this act for the boards of man-  
21 agers may be expended for facility improvements, the purchase and repair  
22 of equipment and furnishings, member services, and other purposes that  
23 benefit the Grand Rapids veterans' home and the D.J. Jacobetti veterans'  
24 home.

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### 1 VETERANS' TRUST FUND

2       Sec. 703. (1) By April 1, 2003, the department shall submit to the  
3 senate and house of representatives appropriations subcommittees on mili-  
4 tary affairs and the state budget office a detailed annual report of the  
5 Michigan veterans' trust fund for fiscal year 2001-2002. The report  
6 shall include information on grants provided from the emergency grant  
7 program and the veterans survivor tuition program, including details con-  
8 cerning the methodology of allocations, the selection of emergency grant  
9 program authorized agents, and a detailed breakdown of trust fund expen-  
10 ditures for that year. The report shall also provide an update on the  
11 department's efforts to reduce program administrative costs.

12       (2) The annual report required under subsection (1) shall contain  
13 information on the veterans survivors tuition program, including the  
14 number of participants, where the participants attended school, payments  
15 made to each school, the average grade point and number of college cred-  
16 its earned by each participant, the number of participants suspended by
