February 21, 2001, Introduced by Senators MC MANUS, GAST, HOFFMAN, SMITH and JOHNSON and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

EXECUTIVE BUDGET BILL

A bill to make appropriations for the department of natural resources for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2002; to provide for the expenditure of those appropriations; to create funds and accounts; to require reports; to prescribe certain powers and duties of certain state agencies and officials; to authorize certain transfers by certain state agencies; and to provide for the disposition of fees and other income received by the various state agencies.

- 3 (a) "Commission" means the commission of natural resources.
- 4 (b) "DAG" means the United States department of agriculture.
- 5 (c) "Department" means the department of natural resources.
- 6 (d) "DOC" means the United States department of commerce.
- 7 (e) "DOD" means the United States department of defense.
- **8** (f) "DOE" means the United States department of energy.
- 9 (g) "DOI" means the United States department of interior.
- 10 (h) "DOI-MMS" means DOI minerals management service.
- 11 (i) "DOT" means the United States department of transportation.

- 17 Sec. 204. The department of civil service shall bill departments
- 18 and agencies at the end of the first fiscal quarter for the 1% charge

- 22 Sec. 205. (1) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1,

- 9 (4) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is
- 10 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$250,000.00 for private
- 11 contingency funds. These funds are not available for expenditure
- 12 until they have been transferred to another line item in this bill
- 13 under section 393(2) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431,

- 15 Sec. 206. Unless otherwise specified the department shall use the
- 16 Internet to fulfill the reporting requirements of this bill. This may
- 17 include transmission of reports via electronic mail to the recipients
- 18 identified for each reporting requirement, or it may include placement
- 19 of reports on an Internet or Intranet site. Quarterly, the department
- 20 shall provide to the appropriations subcommittee members, state budget
- 21 office and the fiscal agencies an electronic and paper copy listing of
- 22 the reports submitted during the most recent 3-month period along with
- 23 the Internet or Intranet site of each report, if any.
- 24 Sec. 207. (1) A hiring freeze is imposed on the state classified
- 25 civil service. State departments and agencies are prohibited from
- 26 hiring any new full-time state classified civil service employees and
- 27 prohibited from filling any vacant state classified civil service
- 28 positions. This hiring freeze does not apply to internal transfers of
- 29 classified employees from one position to another within a department.
- 30 (2) The state budget director shall grant exceptions to this

- 1 hiring freeze when the state budget director believes that the hiring
- 2 freeze will result in rendering a state department or agency unable to
- 3 deliver basic services, cause loss of revenue to the state, result in
- 4 the inability of the state to receive federal funds, or would
- 5 necessitate additional expenditures that exceed any savings from
- 6 maintaining a vacancy. The state budget director shall report by the
- 7 thirtieth of each month to the chairpersons of the senate and house
- 8 standing committees on appropriations the number of exceptions to the
- 9 hiring freeze approved during the previous month and the reasons to
- 10 justify the exception.
- 11 Sec. 208. (1) The negative appropriation for budgetary savings in
- 12 part 1 shall be satisfied by savings from the hiring freeze imposed in
- 13 Section 207 and, if necessary, by other savings identified by the
- 14 department director and approved by the state budget director.
- 15 (2) Appropriation authorizations shall be adjusted after the
- 16 approval of transfers by the legislature pursuant to section 393(2) of
- 17 the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.
- 18 Sec. 209. (1) From funds appropriated under part 1, the
- 19 department shall prepare a report that lists all of the following
- 20 regarding grant, loan, or grant and loan programs administered by the
- 21 department for the fiscal year ending on September 30, 2002:
- 22 (a) The name of each program.
- 23 (b) The goals of the program, the criteria, eligibility, process,
- 24 filing fees, nominating procedures, and deadlines for each program.
- 25 (c) The maximum and minimum grant and loan available and whether
- 26 there is a match requirement for each program.
- 27 (d) The amount of any required match, and whether in-kind
- 28 contributions may be used as part or all of a required match.
- (e) Information pertaining to the application process, timeline
- 30 for each program, and the contact people within the department.

- 1 (f) The source of funds for each program, including the citation
- 2 of pertinent authorizing acts.
- 3 (g) Information regarding plans for the next fiscal year for the
- 4 phaseout, expansion, or changes for each program.
- 5 (h) A listing of all recipients of grants or loans awarded by the
- 6 department by type and amount of grant or loan.
- 7 (2) The reports required under this section shall be submitted to
- 8 the senate and house appropriations committees and the senate and
- 9 house fiscal agencies by January 1, 2002.

10 EXECUTIVE

- 11 Sec. 301. The appropriations in part 1 for the commission may be
- 12 used for per diem payments to the members of the commission or of
- 13 committees of the commission for a full day of commission or committee
- 14 work at which a quorum is present, for attending a hearing as
- 15 authorized by the commission or committee, or for performing official
- 16 business as authorized by the commission or committee. The per diem
- 17 payment for members of the commission of natural resources shall be
- **18** \$75.00.

- 6 Sec. 403. The department may charge the appropriations contained
- 7 in part 1, including all special maintenance and capital projects
- 8 appropriated for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2002, for
- 9 engineering services provided, a standard percentage fee to recover
- 10 actual costs, and may use the revenue derived to support the
- 11 engineering services charges provided for in part 1.

- 13 Sec. 501. (1) From the appropriation in part 1 for stream habitat
- 14 improvement, not more than \$758,000.00 shall be allocated for grants
- 15 to watershed councils, resource development councils, soil
- 16 conservation districts, local governmental units, and other nonprofit
- 17 organizations for stream habitat stabilization and soil erosion
- 18 control.
- 19 (2) The fisheries division of the department shall develop
- 20 priority and cost estimates for all recommended projects.

21 PARKS AND RECREATION

- 22 Sec. 601. In accordance with section 1902(2) of the natural
- 23 resources and environmental protection act, 1994 PA 451, MCL 324.1902,
- 24 there is appropriated from the Michigan natural resources trust fund
- 25 to the Michigan state parks endowment fund an amount not to exceed
- 26 \$10,000,000.00 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2002.

27 FOREST RESOURCES MANAGEMENT

- 28 Sec. 701. Of the funds appropriated in part 1, the department
- 29 shall prescribe appropriate treatment on 69,000 acres, plus or minus
- 30 10% at the current average rate of 12.5 to 13 cords per acre provided

- 1 that the department shall take into consideration silvicultural
- 2 analysis and report annually to the legislature on plans and efforts
- 3 to address factors limiting management.
- 4 Sec. 702. Of the appropriations in part 1 for forest resources
- 5 management, up to \$600,000.00 may be used in the Detroit area to
- 6 support the Detroit 300 Legacy of Trees program.

7 LAND AND MINERAL SERVICES

- 8 Sec. 801. The department may charge land acquisition projects
- 9 appropriated for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2002, and for
- 10 prior fiscal years, a standard percentage fee to recover actual costs,
- 11 and may use the revenue derived to support the land acquisition
- 12 service charges provided for in part 1.
- 13 Sec. 802. The land sale fund is created. An amount equal to the
- 14 cost of personal services, printing, postage, advertising, contractual
- 15 services, and facility rental associated with tax reverted lands shall
- 16 be deducted from the sales and credited to the land sale fund.
- 17 Sec. 803. The appropriation in part 1 for abandoned mine shaft
- 18 closures shall be used to restrict access to or cap abandoned mine
- 19 shafts in order of priority as determined by the department.

20 GRANTS

- 21 Sec. 901. The amount appropriated in part 1 for federal-rural
- 22 community fire protection shall be awarded as grants to local fire
- 23 protection departments. To be eligible, local fire protection
- 24 departments shall be located in governmental units or fire protection
- 25 districts with permanent populations of less than 10,000 and with
- 26 publicly owned forested land.
- 27 Sec. 902. Federal pass-through funds to local institutions and
- 28 governments that are received in amounts in addition to those included
- 29 in part 1 for grants to communities federal oil, gas, and timber
- 30 payments and that do not require additional state matching funds are

- 1 appropriated for the purposes intended. The department shall report
- 2 to the senate and house appropriations subcommittees on natural
- 3 resources, the state budget office, and the senate and house fiscal
- 4 agencies on all amounts appropriated under this section.
