Analysis

Summary

Senate Bill 801, as passed by the Senate, would amend 1899 PA 44, which governs the publication and distribution of state laws and other documents. SB 801 would delete the requirement that the Department of Management and Budget distribute a specific number of the publication containing the public and local acts of each legislative session to legislators and others, and would require the Legislative Service Bureau, at the direction of the Legislative Council, to publish at least one printed copy of the publication. The Legislative Service Bureau would be required to make the publication available on the Internet and would be authorized to publish additional copies of the public and local acts if directed to do so by the Legislative Council.

Fiscal Impact

Senate Bill 801, as passed by the Senate, would result in a minimal amount of savings to the state, perhaps between \$5,000 and \$10,000. Any savings resulting from the bill would help to offset reductions taken in the FY 2004 Legislative Council /Legislative Service Bureau budgets.
