A SUMMARY OF SENATE BILL 908 AS PASSED BY THE SENATE

In general, the Public Health Code prohibits a practitioner from dispensing a prescription for a controlled substance that was written by a physician licensed to practice in another state, though the code does provide an exception for physicians whose practices are located adjacent to the land border between Michigan and adjoining states.

<u>Senate Bill 908</u> would amend the code to also create an exception for physicians licensed by the state of Illinois. Under the bill, a practitioner could dispense a prescription for a controlled substance that was written and signed or transmitted by a licensed physician residing adjacent to the land border between Michigan and another state <u>or residing in Illinois</u>, who is authorized to prescribe controlled substances, and whose practice extends into the state even though he or she did not maintain an office or designate a place to meet patients or receive calls in the state.
