HOUSE BILL No. 4008

January 27, 2005, Introduced by Rep. Caswell and referred to the Committee on Higher Education.

A bill to amend 1972 PA 251, entitled

"An act to provide for the reciprocal exchange of educational services between this state and other states; to provide for reduced or waived tuition, and to designate the state agency for negotiating agreements,"

by amending sections 1, 3, and 4 (MCL 390.501, 390.503, and 390.504).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 1. As used in this act, "reciprocal agreement" means a contractual arrangement permitting resident students of a designated state to be admitted to a public institution of higher education in another state at an agreed tuition rate less than normally charged nonresident students of that state. - 2 Sec. 3. (1) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the
- 3 contrary, a reciprocal agreement may include provisions for the
- 4 reduction or waiver of nonresident tuition and fees for residents

- 17 STUDENT ATTENDING A PUBLIC INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION IN THIS
- 18 STATE UNDER A RECIPROCAL AGREEMENT IS THE RATE FOR IN-STATE, OUT-
- 19 OF-DISTRICT STUDENTS.
