HOUSE BILL No. 4755

May 10, 2005, Introduced by Reps. Ward, Elsenheimer, Brown, Hune, Steil, Jones, Hildenbrand, Gosselin, Drolet, Hummel, Palmer, Pastor and Kooiman and referred to the Committee on House Oversight, Elections, and Ethics.

A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled

"Michigan election law,"

by amending sections 302 and 381 (MCL 168.302 and 168.381), section 302 as added by 2003 PA 302 and section 381 as amended by 2004 PA 290, and by adding sections 642c and 642d.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 302. An individual is eligible for election as a school

board member if the individual is a citizen of the United States and is a qualified and registered elector of the school district the individual seeks to represent by the filing deadline. At least 1 school board member for a school district shall be elected at each of the school district's regular elections held as provided in 7 section -642a-642C. Except as otherwise provided in this section
