SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 4763

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

by amending section 5453 (MCL 333.5453), as amended by 2002 PA 644.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 5453. (1) "Abatement", except as otherwise provided in
- 2 subsection (2), means a measure or set of measures designed to
- 3 permanently eliminate lead-based paint hazards. Abatement includes
- 4 all of the following:
- 5 (a) The removal of lead-based paint and dust lead hazards, the
- 6 permanent enclosure or encapsulation of lead-based paint, the
- 7 replacement of lead-painted surfaces or fixtures, the removal or
- 8 covering of soil lead hazards, and all preparation, cleanup,

- 1 disposal, and postabatement clearance testing activities associated
- 2 with such measures.
- 3 (b) A project for which there is a written contract or other
- 4 documentation that provides that a person will be conducting
- 5 activities in or to a residential dwelling or child occupied
- 6 facility that will result in the permanent elimination of lead-
- 7 based paint hazards or that are designed to permanently eliminate
- 8 lead-based paint hazards.
- 9 (c) A project resulting in the permanent elimination of lead-
- 10 based paint hazards, conducted by a person certified under this
- 11 part, except a project that is exempt from this part.
- 12 (d) A project resulting in the permanent elimination of lead-
- 13 based paint hazards, conducted by a person who, through their
- 14 company name or promotional literature, represents, advertises, or
- 15 holds themselves out to be in the business of performing lead-based
- 16 paint activities except a project that is exempt from this part.
- 17 (e) A project resulting in the permanent elimination of lead-
- 18 based paint hazards that is conducted in response to a state or
- 19 local government abatement order.
- 20 (2) Abatement does not include any of the following:
- 21 (a) Renovation, remodeling, landscaping, or other activity, if
- 22 the activity is not designed to permanently eliminate lead-based
- 23 paint hazards, but is instead designed to repair, restore, or
- 24 remodel a structure, target housing, or dwelling even though the
- 25 activity may incidentally result in a reduction or elimination of a
- 26 lead-based paint hazard.
- 27 (b) An interim control, operation, and maintenance activity,

- 1 or other measure or activity designed to temporarily, but not
- permanently, reduce a lead-based paint hazard.
- 3 (c) Any lead-based paint activity performed by the owner of an
- 4 owner-occupied residential dwelling or an owner-occupied
- 5 multifamily dwelling containing 4 or fewer units if the activity is
- 6 performed only in that owner-occupied unit of the multifamily
- 7 dwelling.
- 8 (D) THE SCRAPING OR REMOVAL OF PAINT, PAINTING OVER PAINT, OR
- 9 OTHER SIMILAR ACTIVITY THAT HAS THE EFFECT OF REDUCING OR
- 10 ELIMINATING A LEAD-BASED PAINT HAZARD, IF THE ACTIVITY MEETS ALL OF
- 11 THE FOLLOWING:
- 12 (i) THE ACTIVITY IS PERFORMED ONLY ON RESIDENTIAL OR
- 13 MULTIFAMILY DWELLINGS CONTAINING 4 OR FEWER UNITS.
- 14 (ii) THE ACTIVITY IS COORDINATED BY A NONPROFIT CHARITABLE OR
- 15 VOLUNTEER ORGANIZATION, WHICH ORGANIZATION IS IN COMPLIANCE WITH
- 16 THE PROCEDURES ESTABLISHED UNDER SUBPART J OF PART 35 OF TITLE 24
- 17 OF THE CODE OF FEDERAL REGULATIONS, 24 CFR 35.900 TO 35.940.
- 18 (iii) THE ACTIVITY IS PERFORMED ONLY BY UNPAID VOLUNTEERS AND
- 19 THE ORGANIZATION RECEIVES NO REMUNERATION DIRECTLY FROM THE OWNER
- 20 OR OCCUPANT OF THE RESIDENTIAL DWELLING OR MULTIFAMILY DWELLING.
- 21 (iv) THE ACTIVITY DOES NOT INVOLVE THE USE OF A LEAD-BASED
- 22 PAINT ENCAPSULATING PRODUCT THAT REQUIRES CERTIFICATION FROM THE
- 23 DEPARTMENT.
- 24 (3) "Accredited training program" means a training program
- 25 that has been accredited by the department under this part to
- 26 provide training for individuals engaged in lead-based paint
- 27 activities.

- 1 (4) "Adequate quality control" means a plan or design that
- 2 ensures the authenticity, integrity, and accuracy of a sample
- 3 including, but not limited to, a dust sample, a soil or paint chip
- 4 sample, or a paint film sample. Adequate quality control also
- 5 includes a provision in a plan or design described in this
- 6 subsection for representative sampling.
