SENATE BILL No. 1156

EXECUTIVE BUDGET BILL

February 28, 2008, Introduced by Senators BARCIA and SWITALSKI and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to make appropriations for the department of state police and certain other state purposes for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2009; to provide for the expenditure of those appropriations; to provide for certain reports and the consideration of those reports; to provide for the disposition of other income received by the various state agencies; to provide for certain emergency powers; and to provide for the powers and duties of certain committees, certain state agencies, and certain employees.

- 18 Sec. 203. As used in this bill:
- 19 (a) "AFIS" means the automated fingerprint identification
- 20 system.
- 21 (b) "Department" means the department of state police.
- 22 (c) "DHS" means the United States department of homeland
- 23 security.
- (d) "Director" means the director of the department of state
- 25 police.
- 26 (e) "DNA" means deoxyribonucleic acid.
- 27 (f) "DOJ" means the United States department of justice.

- 1 (g) "DOT" means the United States department of
- 2 transportation.
- 3 (h) "FEMA" means the federal emergency management agency.
- 4 (i) "FTE" means full-time equated.

- 20 and agencies at the end of the first fiscal quarter for the 1%

- 23 of the billing by the end of the second fiscal quarter.
- 24 Sec. 205. (1) A hiring freeze is imposed on the state
- 25 classified civil service. State departments and agencies are
- 26 prohibited from hiring any new full-time state classified civil
- 27 service employees and prohibited from filling any vacant state

- 1 classified civil service positions. This hiring freeze does not
- 2 apply to internal transfers of classified employees from 1 position

- 27 (3) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is

- 1 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$1,000,000.00 for local
- 2 contingency funds. These funds are not available for expenditure
- 3 until they have been transferred to another line item in this bill
- 4 under section 393(2) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431,
- **5** MCL 18.1393.
- 6 (4) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is
- 7 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$200,000.00 for private
- 8 contingency funds. These funds are not available for expenditure
- 9 until they have been transferred to another line item in this bill
- 10 under section 393(2) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431,
- **11** MCL 18.1393.
- 12 Sec. 208. The department shall use the Internet to fulfill the
- 13 reporting requirements of this bill. This requirement may include
- 14 transmission of reports via electronic mail to the recipients
- 15 identified for each reporting requirement, or it may include
- 16 placement of reports on an Internet or Intranet site.
- 17 Sec. 209. Funds appropriated in part 1 shall not be used for
- 18 the purchase of foreign goods or services, or both, if
- 19 competitively priced and of comparable quality American goods or
- 20 services, or both, are available. Preference shall be given to
- 21 goods or services, or both, manufactured or provided by Michigan
- 22 businesses, if they are competitively priced and of comparable
- 23 quality. In addition, preference shall be given to goods or
- 24 services, or both, that are manufactured or provided by Michigan
- 25 businesses owned and operated by veterans, if they are
- 26 competitively priced and of comparable quality.
- Sec. 210. The director shall take all reasonable steps to

- 1 ensure businesses in deprived and depressed communities compete for
- 2 and perform contracts to provide services or supplies, or both. The
- 3 director shall strongly encourage firms with which the department
- 4 contracts to subcontract with certified businesses in depressed and
- 5 deprived communities for services, supplies, or both.
- 6 Sec. 218. Funds appropriated in part 1 for at-post troopers
- 7 shall only be expended for trooper salaries, wages, benefits,
- 8 retirement, equipment, supplies, and other expenses directly
- 9 related to state troopers assigned to general law enforcement
- 10 duties at a department post, detachment, satellite office, or a
- 11 resident trooper function.
- Sec. 223. (1) Due to the current budgetary problems in this
- 13 state, out-of-state travel for the fiscal year ending September 30,

- 17 for law enforcement purposes.

- 27 staff that is not available within this state.

- 1 (f) The travel is financed entirely by federal or nonstate
- 2 funds.
- 3 (2) If out-of-state travel is necessary but does not meet 1 or
- 4 more of the conditions in subsection (1), the state budget director
- 5 may grant an exception to allow the travel. Any exceptions granted
- 6 by the state budget director shall be reported on a monthly basis
- 7 to the senate and house of representatives standing committees on
- 8 appropriations.
- 9 (3) Not later than January 1 of each year, each department
- 10 shall prepare a travel report listing all travel by classified and
- 11 unclassified employees outside this state in the immediately
- 12 preceding fiscal year that was funded in whole or in part with
- 13 funds appropriated in the department's budget. The report shall be
- 14 submitted to the senate and house of representatives standing
- 15 committees on appropriations, the senate and house fiscal agencies,
- 16 and the state budget director. The report shall include the
- 17 following information:
- 18 (a) The name of each person receiving reimbursement for travel
- 19 outside this state or whose travel costs were paid by this state.
- 20 (b) The destination of each travel occurrence.
- 21 (c) The dates of each travel occurrence.
- 22 (d) A brief statement of the reason for each travel
- 23 occurrence.
- (e) The transportation and related costs of each travel
- 25 occurrence, including the proportion funded with state general
- 26 fund/general purpose revenues, the proportion funded with state
- 27 restricted revenues, the proportion funded with federal revenues,

- 1 and the proportion funded with other revenues.
- 2 (f) A total of all out-of-state travel funded for the
- 3 immediately preceding fiscal year.
- 4 Sec. 234. Funds appropriated in part 1 shall not be used by a
- 5 principal executive department, state agency, or authority to hire
- 6 a person to provide legal services that are the responsibility of
- 7 the attorney general. This prohibition does not apply to legal
- 8 services for bonding activities and for those activities that the
- 9 attorney general authorizes.

10 INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

- 11 Sec. 301. The money appropriated in part 1 for computer
- 12 services shall be funded by LEIN user fees sufficient to pay 1/3 of
- 13 the service and contract maintenance costs of the LEIN system.
- 14 Sec. 302. From the funds appropriated in part 1 for
- 15 information technology, departments and agencies shall pay user
- 16 fees to the department of information technology for technology-
- 17 related services and projects. Such user fees shall be subject to
- 18 provisions of an interagency agreement between the departments and
- 19 agencies and the department of information technology.
- Sec. 303. Amounts appropriated in part 1 for information
- 21 technology may be designated as work projects and carried forward
- 22 to support technology projects under the direction of the
- 23 department of information technology. Funds designated in this
- 24 manner are not available for expenditure until approved as work
- 25 projects under section 451a of the management and budget act, 1984

1 HIGHWAY SAFETY PLANNING

- 2 Sec. 401. On a quarterly basis, the department shall report to
- 3 the senate and house appropriations subcommittees on state police
- 4 and military affairs on the status of assessments collected and
- 5 authorized under section 629e of the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA
- 6 300, MCL 257.629e, for the purposes of supporting the secondary
- 7 road patrol grant program. Each quarterly report shall contain
- 8 updated information on collection levels, revised projected grant
- 9 allotments to counties for the year, a comparison of projected
- 10 collections and grant distribution levels with the funds
- 11 appropriated in part 1 for the secondary road patrol program, and
- 12 the extent collection levels have exceeded or failed to meet
- 13 appropriated levels for the preceding fiscal year or expenditure
- 14 levels from the previous fiscal year.

15 FORENSIC SCIENCES

- 16 Sec. 501. When changes are made to the department's protocol
- 17 for retaining and purging DNA analysis samples and records, the
- 18 department shall provide an updated copy to every police agency in
- 19 the state.

20 MICHIGAN COMMISSION ON LAW ENFORCEMENT STANDARDS

- 21 Sec. 601. The money appropriated to the MCOLES for maintenance
- 22 and delivery of training to locals is provided in accordance with a
- 23 state reimbursement policy in which 100% of the determined state
- 24 reimbursement rate shall be distributed upon certification by the

1 MCOLES.

- 2 Sec. 604. From the funds appropriated in part 1 to the
- 3 Michigan commission on law enforcement standards funds may be used
- 4 to provide training for motor carrier officers and capitol security
- 5 officers for the purpose of qualifying them for MCOLES
- 6 certification.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

- 8 Sec. 801. (1) The state director of emergency management may
- 9 expend money appropriated under this bill to call upon any agency
- 10 or department of the state or any resource of the state to protect
- 11 life or property or to provide for the health or safety of the
- 12 population in any area of the state in which the governor proclaims
- 13 a state of emergency or state of disaster under 1945 PA 302, MCL
- 14 10.31 to 10.33, or under the emergency management act, 1976 PA 390,
- 15 MCL 30.401 to 30.421. The state director of emergency management
- 16 may expend the amounts the director considers necessary to
- 17 accomplish these purposes. The director shall submit to the state
- 18 budget director as soon as possible a complete report of all
- 19 actions taken under the authority of this section. The report shall
- 20 contain, as a separate item, a statement of all money expended that
- 21 is not reimbursable from federal money. The state budget director
- 22 shall review the expenditures and submit recommendations to the
- 23 legislature in regard to any possible need for a supplemental
- 24 appropriation.
- 25 (2) In addition to the money appropriated in this bill, the
- 26 department may receive and expend money from local, private,

- 1 federal, or state sources for the purpose of providing emergency
- 2 management training to local or private interests and for the
- 3 purpose of supporting emergency preparedness, response, recovery,
- 4 and mitigation activity. If additional expenditure authorization in
- 5 the Michigan administrative information network is approved by the
- 6 state budget office under this section, the department and the
- 7 state budget office shall notify the house and senate
- 8 appropriations subcommittees on state police and military and
- 9 veterans affairs and the house and senate fiscal agencies within 10
- 10 days after the approval. The notification shall include the amount
- 11 and source of the additional authorization, the date of its
- 12 approval, and the projected use of funds to be expended under the
- 13 authorization.

14 POST UNIFORM SERVICES

- 15 Sec. 901. State police enlisted personnel who are employed to
- 16 enforce traffic laws as provided in section 629e of the Michigan
- vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.629e, shall not be prohibited
- 18 from responding to crimes in progress or other emergency
- 19 situations, and are responsible for protecting every citizen of
- 20 this state from harm.

STATEWIDE FIELD OPERATIONS

- 22 Sec. 1002. Money privately donated to the department is
- 23 appropriated under part 1 to be used for the purposes designated by
- 24 the donor of the money. Money privately donated to the department's
- 25 canine unit shall be used to purchase equipment and other items to

1 enhance the operation of the canine unit.
