

# SENATE BILL No. 1156

## EXECUTIVE BUDGET BILL

February 28, 2008, Introduced by Senators BARCIA and SWITALSKI and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to make appropriations for the department of state police and certain other state purposes for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2009; to provide for the expenditure of those appropriations; to provide for certain reports and the consideration of those reports; to provide for the disposition of other income received by the various state agencies; to provide for certain emergency powers; and to provide for the powers and duties of certain committees, certain state agencies, and certain employees.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

20 PROVISIONS CONCERNING APPROPRIATIONS

21 **GENERAL SECTIONS**

22 Sec. 201. Pursuant to section 30 of article IX of the state  
 23 constitution of 1963, total state spending from state resources  
 24 under part 1 for fiscal year 2008-2009 is \$399,671,100.00 and state  
 25 spending from state resources to be paid to local units of

government for fiscal year 2008-2009 is \$20,541,400.00. The itemized statement below identifies appropriations from which spending to local units of government will occur:

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Sec. 202. The appropriations authorized under this bill are subject to the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101 to 18.1594.

Sec. 203. As used in this bill:

(a) "AFIS" means the automated fingerprint identification system.

(b) "Department" means the department of state police.

(c) "DHS" means the United States department of homeland security.

(d) "Director" means the director of the department of state police.

(e) "DNA" means deoxyribonucleic acid.

(f) "DOJ" means the United States department of justice.

1 (g) "DOT" means the United States department of  
2 transportation.

3 (h) "FEMA" means the federal emergency management agency.

4 (i) "FTE" means full-time equated.

5 (j) "IDG" means interdepartmental grant.

6 (k) "IDT" means intradepartmental transfer.

7 (l) "LEIN" means law enforcement information network.

8 (m) "MCOLES" means the Michigan commission on law enforcement  
9 standards.

10 (n) "MDCH" means the Michigan department of community health.

11 (o) "MDMB" means the Michigan department of management and  
12 budget.

13 (p) "MDOC" means the Michigan department of corrections.

14 (q) "MDOS" means the Michigan department of state.

15 (r) "MDOT" means the Michigan department of transportation.

16 (s) "MDTR" means the Michigan department of treasury.

17 (t) "MPSCS" means the Michigan public safety communications  
18 system.

19 Sec. 204. The civil service commission shall bill departments  
20 and agencies at the end of the first fiscal quarter for the 1%  
21 charge authorized by section 5 of article XI of the state  
22 constitution of 1963. Payments shall be made for the total amount  
23 of the billing by the end of the second fiscal quarter.

24 Sec. 205. (1) A hiring freeze is imposed on the state  
25 classified civil service. State departments and agencies are  
26 prohibited from hiring any new full-time state classified civil  
27 service employees and prohibited from filling any vacant state

1 classified civil service positions. This hiring freeze does not  
2 apply to internal transfers of classified employees from 1 position  
3 to another within a department.

4 (2) The state budget director may grant exceptions to this  
5 hiring freeze when the state budget director believes that the  
6 hiring freeze will result in rendering a state department or agency  
7 unable to deliver basic services, cause loss of revenue to the  
8 state, result in the inability of the state to receive federal  
9 funds, or necessitate additional expenditures that exceed any  
10 savings from maintaining a vacancy. The state budget director shall  
11 report quarterly to the chairpersons of the senate and house of  
12 representatives standing committees on appropriations the number of  
13 exceptions to the hiring freeze approved during the previous  
14 quarter and the reasons to justify the exception.

15 Sec. 206. (1) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1,  
16 there is appropriated an amount not to exceed \$10,000,000.00 for  
17 federal contingency funds. These funds are not available for  
18 expenditure until they have been transferred to another line item  
19 in this bill under section 393(2) of the management and budget act,  
20 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.

21 (2) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is  
22 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$3,500,000.00 for state  
23 restricted contingency funds. These funds are not available for  
24 expenditure until they have been transferred to another line item  
25 in this bill under section 393(2) of the management and budget act,  
26 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.

27 (3) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is



1 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$1,000,000.00 for local  
2 contingency funds. These funds are not available for expenditure  
3 until they have been transferred to another line item in this bill  
4 under section 393(2) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431,  
5 MCL 18.1393.

6 (4) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is  
7 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$200,000.00 for private  
8 contingency funds. These funds are not available for expenditure  
9 until they have been transferred to another line item in this bill  
10 under section 393(2) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431,  
11 MCL 18.1393.

12 Sec. 208. The department shall use the Internet to fulfill the  
13 reporting requirements of this bill. This requirement may include  
14 transmission of reports via electronic mail to the recipients  
15 identified for each reporting requirement, or it may include  
16 placement of reports on an Internet or Intranet site.

17 Sec. 209. Funds appropriated in part 1 shall not be used for  
18 the purchase of foreign goods or services, or both, if  
19 competitively priced and of comparable quality American goods or  
20 services, or both, are available. Preference shall be given to  
21 goods or services, or both, manufactured or provided by Michigan  
22 businesses, if they are competitively priced and of comparable  
23 quality. In addition, preference shall be given to goods or  
24 services, or both, that are manufactured or provided by Michigan  
25 businesses owned and operated by veterans, if they are  
26 competitively priced and of comparable quality.

27 Sec. 210. The director shall take all reasonable steps to

1 ensure businesses in deprived and depressed communities compete for  
2 and perform contracts to provide services or supplies, or both. The  
3 director shall strongly encourage firms with which the department  
4 contracts to subcontract with certified businesses in depressed and  
5 deprived communities for services, supplies, or both.

6       Sec. 218. Funds appropriated in part 1 for at-post troopers  
7 shall only be expended for trooper salaries, wages, benefits,  
8 retirement, equipment, supplies, and other expenses directly  
9 related to state troopers assigned to general law enforcement  
10 duties at a department post, detachment, satellite office, or a  
11 resident trooper function.

12       Sec. 223. (1) Due to the current budgetary problems in this  
13 state, out-of-state travel for the fiscal year ending September 30,  
14 2009 shall be limited to situations in which 1 or more of the  
15 following conditions apply:

16       (a) The travel is required by legal mandate or court order or  
17 for law enforcement purposes.

18       (b) The travel is necessary to protect the health or safety of  
19 Michigan citizens or visitors or to assist other states in similar  
20 circumstances.

21       (c) The travel is necessary to produce budgetary savings or to  
22 increase state revenues, including protecting existing federal  
23 funds or securing additional federal funds.

24       (d) The travel is necessary to comply with federal  
25 requirements.

26       (e) The travel is necessary to secure specialized training for  
27 staff that is not available within this state.

1 (f) The travel is financed entirely by federal or nonstate  
2 funds.

3 (2) If out-of-state travel is necessary but does not meet 1 or  
4 more of the conditions in subsection (1), the state budget director  
5 may grant an exception to allow the travel. Any exceptions granted  
6 by the state budget director shall be reported on a monthly basis  
7 to the senate and house of representatives standing committees on  
8 appropriations.

9 (3) Not later than January 1 of each year, each department  
10 shall prepare a travel report listing all travel by classified and  
11 unclassified employees outside this state in the immediately  
12 preceding fiscal year that was funded in whole or in part with  
13 funds appropriated in the department's budget. The report shall be  
14 submitted to the senate and house of representatives standing  
15 committees on appropriations, the senate and house fiscal agencies,  
16 and the state budget director. The report shall include the  
17 following information:

18 (a) The name of each person receiving reimbursement for travel  
19 outside this state or whose travel costs were paid by this state.

20 (b) The destination of each travel occurrence.

21 (c) The dates of each travel occurrence.

22 (d) A brief statement of the reason for each travel  
23 occurrence.

24 (e) The transportation and related costs of each travel  
25 occurrence, including the proportion funded with state general  
26 fund/general purpose revenues, the proportion funded with state  
27 restricted revenues, the proportion funded with federal revenues,

1 and the proportion funded with other revenues.

2 (f) A total of all out-of-state travel funded for the  
3 immediately preceding fiscal year.

4 Sec. 234. Funds appropriated in part 1 shall not be used by a  
5 principal executive department, state agency, or authority to hire  
6 a person to provide legal services that are the responsibility of  
7 the attorney general. This prohibition does not apply to legal  
8 services for bonding activities and for those activities that the  
9 attorney general authorizes.

#### 10 INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

11 Sec. 301. The money appropriated in part 1 for computer  
12 services shall be funded by LEIN user fees sufficient to pay 1/3 of  
13 the service and contract maintenance costs of the LEIN system.

14 Sec. 302. From the funds appropriated in part 1 for  
15 information technology, departments and agencies shall pay user  
16 fees to the department of information technology for technology-  
17 related services and projects. Such user fees shall be subject to  
18 provisions of an interagency agreement between the departments and  
19 agencies and the department of information technology.

20 Sec. 303. Amounts appropriated in part 1 for information  
21 technology may be designated as work projects and carried forward  
22 to support technology projects under the direction of the  
23 department of information technology. Funds designated in this  
24 manner are not available for expenditure until approved as work  
25 projects under section 451a of the management and budget act, 1984  
26 PA 431, MCL 18.1451a.

**HIGHWAY SAFETY PLANNING**

Sec. 401. On a quarterly basis, the department shall report to the senate and house appropriations subcommittees on state police and military affairs on the status of assessments collected and authorized under section 629e of the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.629e, for the purposes of supporting the secondary road patrol grant program. Each quarterly report shall contain updated information on collection levels, revised projected grant allotments to counties for the year, a comparison of projected collections and grant distribution levels with the funds appropriated in part 1 for the secondary road patrol program, and the extent collection levels have exceeded or failed to meet appropriated levels for the preceding fiscal year or expenditure levels from the previous fiscal year.

**FORENSIC SCIENCES**

Sec. 501. When changes are made to the department's protocol for retaining and purging DNA analysis samples and records, the department shall provide an updated copy to every police agency in the state.

**MICHIGAN COMMISSION ON LAW ENFORCEMENT STANDARDS**

Sec. 601. The money appropriated to the MCOLES for maintenance and delivery of training to locals is provided in accordance with a state reimbursement policy in which 100% of the determined state reimbursement rate shall be distributed upon certification by the

1 MCOLES.

2       Sec. 604. From the funds appropriated in part 1 to the  
3 Michigan commission on law enforcement standards funds may be used  
4 to provide training for motor carrier officers and capitol security  
5 officers for the purpose of qualifying them for MCOLES  
6 certification.

7 **EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT**

8       Sec. 801. (1) The state director of emergency management may  
9 expend money appropriated under this bill to call upon any agency  
10 or department of the state or any resource of the state to protect  
11 life or property or to provide for the health or safety of the  
12 population in any area of the state in which the governor proclaims  
13 a state of emergency or state of disaster under 1945 PA 302, MCL  
14 10.31 to 10.33, or under the emergency management act, 1976 PA 390,  
15 MCL 30.401 to 30.421. The state director of emergency management  
16 may expend the amounts the director considers necessary to  
17 accomplish these purposes. The director shall submit to the state  
18 budget director as soon as possible a complete report of all  
19 actions taken under the authority of this section. The report shall  
20 contain, as a separate item, a statement of all money expended that  
21 is not reimbursable from federal money. The state budget director  
22 shall review the expenditures and submit recommendations to the  
23 legislature in regard to any possible need for a supplemental  
24 appropriation.

25       (2) In addition to the money appropriated in this bill, the  
26 department may receive and expend money from local, private,

1 federal, or state sources for the purpose of providing emergency  
2 management training to local or private interests and for the  
3 purpose of supporting emergency preparedness, response, recovery,  
4 and mitigation activity. If additional expenditure authorization in  
5 the Michigan administrative information network is approved by the  
6 state budget office under this section, the department and the  
7 state budget office shall notify the house and senate  
8 appropriations subcommittees on state police and military and  
9 veterans affairs and the house and senate fiscal agencies within 10  
10 days after the approval. The notification shall include the amount  
11 and source of the additional authorization, the date of its  
12 approval, and the projected use of funds to be expended under the  
13 authorization.

#### 14 **POST UNIFORM SERVICES**

15 Sec. 901. State police enlisted personnel who are employed to  
16 enforce traffic laws as provided in section 629e of the Michigan  
17 vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.629e, shall not be prohibited  
18 from responding to crimes in progress or other emergency  
19 situations, and are responsible for protecting every citizen of  
20 this state from harm.

#### 21 **STATEWIDE FIELD OPERATIONS**

22 Sec. 1002. Money privately donated to the department is  
23 appropriated under part 1 to be used for the purposes designated by  
24 the donor of the money. Money privately donated to the department's  
25 canine unit shall be used to purchase equipment and other items to

- 1 enhance the operation of the canine unit.
